Letter from our Pastor

An Extraordinary Parish for Ordinary People

Dear Friends in Christ,

It wasn't all study and tourism and profound spiritual experiences during *Lessons From My Sabbatical*. I rode in a hot air balloon at sunrise over Kapadokya, where St Gregory of Nyssa and Basil the Great wrote some of the greatest theology of all time; I lounged on the beach at Dalaman enjoying a weekend away from a city of 16 million people and discovered that it's beautiful to see the stars and the moon without lights to distract you; I drank raki where the founder of modern Turkey, Mustafa Kemal Atatürk planned a new country from the ashes of the Ottoman empire with the same noble refugees from the Russian Revolution that were portrayed in the TV program that was my introduction to the Turkish language three years ago now. But all good things come to an end. A friend came to stay with me in Istanbul and he said, "I haven't seen you this happy in years, why not just stay here and enjoy life for a bit?" But Oxford was part of my original sabbatical plan, and nothing intervened to hinder my going, so after a teary goodbye from my friends, especially at the Cathedral of Istanbul, I arrived in England to start the third part of my sabbatical.

We always think of Jesus speaking Hebrew, but the actual vernacular of the time was Aramaic, which is written in Hebrew characters. It is also known as Syriac, which is written not in just one, but three alphabets. There's something very beautiful about trying to learn the same language Mary spoke to Jesus in, and saying the same words Jesus said over bread and wine at the Last Supper, words that are still sung in Syriac to this day at the Maronite liturgy. There are a few villages of Christians and monasteries where Catholic and Orthodox Christians in Turkey, Syria, Iraq and Iran still speak Syriac, but it is an endangered language and the persecution of Syriac Christians has forced many of the emigrate, so that now more Christians speak the language of Jesus in Sweden and New Jersey than they do in Syria!

Oxford University's famous Oriental Institute is home to the world's finest hub of Syriac studies in the world, and the current and emeritus professors of Syriac could not have been more helpful in encouraging me to study at the Institute with the world's future Orientalist scholars. One of the more interesting persons I met there was a young man doing his doctoral work in Syriac. As the child of American evangelical missionaries, he grew up in Istanbul, where he converted to Catholicism in college, and became a Conventual Franciscan.

I lived in the famous Anglo-Catholic seminary of St Stephen's House, where candidates for priesthood in the Catholic wing of the Church of England are formed while attending theology courses at Oxford University. The Oxford Movement, which sought to revive that Benedict XVI called the "Catholic potentialities" of Anglicanism, has always produced a number of converts to Rome, and its flagship seminary, colloquially referred to as Stagers, has provided the Catholic Church in England with some of Anglicanism's most brilliant converts. The House is also open to lay students who live side by side with the ordinands (mostly education students, but also Islamic Studies majors), who live in the house as celibates or with their partners (this is the Church of England, after all...), so it provides a unique ecumenical perspective, with a steady stream of Catholic visitors who share in the life of the House.

Oxford's colleges are known for their vibrant liturgical and musical life and so night after night I went to one college after another for Even-song sung by choirs made up of students and professional musicians. It was always wonderful to see students dressed in white tie with academic gown, carrying their mortarboards, going to formal meals in college, attending lectures and grilling their teachers over tutorials. The Oxford educational system is unique, and as the premier university in the world, it was incredible to be in a place where some of the most brilliant minds of the present and future search for truth where the medieval heritage of Catholic intellectual culture and worship is still a living breathing reality, even if a shadow of its former glory.

My lesson from there: *Education is not like filling a glass with water, but kindling a fire. Traditions that bind students who earnestly seek knowledge with great freedom are important. Whether that knowledge is cutting edge scientific discovery or learning to speak the language of Jesus, it's all important that institutions of learning thrive.*

Celebrating the Liturgical Life of the Church

10 February: Feast of Saint Scholastica. Scholastica was the twin sister of Saint Benedict, the Patriarch of Western monasticism. She was born in Umbria, Italy, about 480. Under Benedict's direction, Scholastica founded a community of nuns near the great Benedictine monastery Monte Cassino. Inspired by Benedict, from early youth Scholastica dedicated her life to seeking and serving God. In his *Second Book of Dialogues*, Pope St. Gregory described the last meeting between these holy twins: "His sister Scholastica, who had been consecrated to God in early childhood, used to visit with him once a year. On these occasions he would go to meet her in a house belonging to the monastery a short distance from the entrance. For this particular visit he joined her there and they spent the whole day singing God's praises and conversing about the spiritual life. When darkness was setting in they took their meal together and continued their conversation until it was quite late. Then the holy nun said to him, 'Please do not leave me tonight, brother. Let us keep on talking about the joys of heaven till morning.' 'What are you saying, sister?' he replied. 'You know that I cannot stay away from the monastery.' The sky was so clear at the time, there was not a cloud in sight. "At her brother's refusal Scholastica folded her hands on the table and rested her head upon them in earnest prayer. When she looked up again, there was a sudden burst of lightning and thunder accompanied by such a downpour that Benedict and his companions were unable to set foot outside the door. By shedding a flood of tears while she prayed, this holy nun had darkened the cloudless sky with a heavy rain. The storm began as soon as her prayer was over; thunder was already resounding as she raised her head. Realizing that he could not return to the abbey in this terrible storm, Benedict complained bitterly. 'God forgive you, sister!' he said. 'What have you done?' Scholastica simply answered, 'When I appealed to you, you would not listen to me. So I turned to my God and He heard my prayer. Leave now if you can. Leave me here and go back to your monastery.' This, of course, he could not do. He had no choice now but to stay. They spent the entire night together and both of them derived great profit from the holy thoughts exchanged about the interior life. The next morning Scholastica returned to her convent and Benedict to his monastery. Three days later as he stood in his room looking up toward the sky, he beheld his sister's soul leaving her body and entering the heavenly court in the form of a dove. Overjoyed at her eternal glory, he gave thanks to God in hymns of praise. Then, after informing his brethren of her death, he sent them to bring her body to the abbey and bury it in the tomb he had prepared for himself. The bodies of these two now to share a common resting place, just as in life their souls had always been one in God." Saint Scholastica died in the year 547. She is the patron saint of convulsive children, nuns, and for protection from rain and storms.



Ideas for celebrating this feast day:

- Tell your children about the "holy twins": St. Scholastica and the love she had for her brother St. Benedict. Ask them how they can help one another become saints.
- Children can cut paper into the shape of doves to honor St. Scholastica. Decorate the dinner table with these doves. Make an Italian dinner in Scholastica's honor.
