Letter from our Pastor

An Extraordinary Parish for Ordinary People

Dear Friends in Christ,

On 6 August 1944, the Benedictine Nuns of the Blessed Sacrament in Warsaw went down into the cellars of the city where 1000 people were hiding from the Nazis. The nuns had seen their Jewish neighbors in the ghetto transported for extermination, and the outcome of the war for liberation of Catholic Poland seemed bleak. The nuns gathered around their superior and asked for permission to offer their lives to God as a sacrifice so that the war would end. They returned to church, where a few days later as they lay prostrate before the Altar, an air raid hit the dome, which collapsed on top of them. A fire broke out in the rubble, and for everyone working to free the nuns from the inferno heard them singing the antiphon we sing every Sunday after Benediction: Adoremus in aeternum, sanctissimum sacramentum. We adore the Most Holy Sacrament forever. For three days, the nuns sang this hymn of praise to God over and over, each one breathing her last until the last voice stopped.

That was the heroic end by voluntary self-oblation of a community of religious that was founded by Mother Mechtilde deBar, who founded seven convents for perpetual adoration of the Most Blessed Sacrament in the 17th century. Mother Mechtilde brought to Benedictine monastic life a very clear vocation to offer herself to God as a victim for love. The way that she spoke of pure love for God attracted a number of influential people in Parisian society. The Countess of Chateauvieux, Marie de la Guesle, was entrusted by her priest confessor to Mother Mechtilde as spiritual director. She recounted her conversion to adoration after seeing a painting of a pagan ceremony of priests and priestesses adoring an idol with torches in hand. "Those infidels, so imbued with reverence for their idol, would be the condemnation of Christians before the Blessed Sacrament." She entered the convent the day after her husband died.

Queen Anne of Austria was so moved by the deep spirituality of these two sisters that she gave one of her royal houses as a convent and chapel for perpetual adoration. She demonstrated great strength of character by laying aside her regal crown and going to the opening of the new church barefoot with a rope around her neck, like a common criminal went to execution, holding a candle in her hand. A powerful reminder of the humility of the sinner before God begging for the grace of forgiveness before eternal death and the light of Christ from baptism which gave her the possibility of repentance and renewal.

Two nuns and a laywoman taught the high society elite of their time about true devotion and the royal road to heaven. Adoration of the Most High God present in the Sacrament of the Altar isn't just a way to spend some time each week doing something vaguely spiritual. It is the path to union with the divine, and accomplished God's will on earth by which people are inspired by grace to give themselves for love in reparation for the sins of others. What those women did affected so many people for centuries, and even is credited by the pious with assisting in the end of a war.

I have been reading Mother Mechtilde's Breviary of Fire and The Mystery of Incomprehensible Love, which are newly available in English from Angelico Press. Even more interesting than the beautiful words left behind by this nun is the story of her 83 years of life. Her biography reads like an adventure story: civil unrest, wars, intransigent prelates, holy priests, military officers, pious women, social dilettantes, musicians and artisans, men struggling for virtue: all of it weaves in and out of the life of one person a varied tapestry that is scintillating in its brilliance and many faceted in its images. The Eucharistic message of Mother Mechtilde was a simple call to love God. But oh how that message brought her to an adventurous life, when the desire of her soul was to be alone with God. I was also struck by just how many laypeople were inspired by her gracious, elegant friendship to do great things for God.

When I think of the many souls who are part of our St Thomas Aquinas Guild of Perpetual Adoration: if we were to have a God's eye view of their lives, what incredible stories of grace we could see, just like that of Mother Mechtilde!

Celebrating the Liturgical Life of the Church

22 February: Feast of the Chair of Saint Peter. While it may seem like a strange feast, the church is not just celebrating a piece of furniture today. This Feast has been celebrated since the early Church and has multifold meaning. First, it does refer to the actual chair that Peter sat on as the first pope. Officials in the Roman Empire would sit on chairs for official work. This tradition was replicated in the Church. *Cathedra* is Latin for "chair" or "throne" and denominates the chair or seat of a bishop, hence "cathedral" denominates the bishop's church in an episcopal see. The physical "chair of Peter" is encased in a sculpture designed by Bernini located in Saint



Peter's Basilica in Rome. In the apse of the Basilica, a great bronze throne encloses the wooden chair from the ninth century, believed to be Peter's own chair. On the chair itself, Bernini depicts three scenes from Peter's life: the giving of the keys (symbolizing authority to lead the Church), the washing of feet (symbolizing Peter's office is one of service), and Jesus' instruction to "Feed my sheep" (pointing to Peter's role as teacher and guide). Below the chair are statues of four doctors of the Church (Saints Athanasius, John Chrysostom, Ambrose, Augustine). Above the throne is an oval window with the Holy Spirit depicted as a dove. The symbolism of this great work of art is clear: the Holy Spirit guides the Church through Saint Peter and his successors, who authoritatively teach the Word of God through Sacred Scripture and Tradition. This feast day is also about the spiritual authority bestowed upon Saint Peter by Jesus: "You are Peter, and on this rock I will build my church, and the gates of hell shall not prevail against it. I will give you the keys to the kingdom of heaven, and whatever you bind on earth shall be bound in heaven, and whatever you loose on earth shall be loosed in heaven." (Matt. 16:18-19). Pope Benedict XVI wrote: "So what was the 'Chair' of St Peter? Chosen by Christ as the 'rock' on which to build the Church, he began his ministry in Jerusalem... The Church's first 'seat' was the Upper Room, and it is likely that a special place was reserved for Simon Peter in that room where Mary, Mother of Jesus, also prayed with the disciples... Then Peter went to Rome, the center of the Empire... So it is that the See of Rome, which had received the greatest of honors, also has the honor that Christ entrusted to Peter of being at the service of all the particular Churches for the edification and unity of the entire People of God... The See of Rome, after St Peter's travels, thus came to be recognized as the See of the Successor of Peter, and its Bishop's 'cathedra' represented the mission entrusted to him by Christ to tend his entire flock... Celebrating the 'Chair' of Peter, therefore, means attributing a strong spiritual significance to it and recognizing it as a privileged sign of the love of God, the eternal Good Shepherd, who wanted to gather his whole Church and lead her on the path of salvation." In the fourth century, St. Jerome wrote to Pope Damascus I: "I follow no leader but Christ and join in communion with none but Your Blessedness, that is, with the chair of Peter. I know that this is the rock on which the Church has been built."

Ideas for celebrating this feast at home:

- Pray the <u>Litany of St. Peter</u>.
- See images of the Chair of Peter here. Read more about the chair here.
- Watch "Peter: Keeper of the Keys" on FORMED
- A symbol for Saint Peter is keys (the keys to the kingdom). A fun feast day activity would be to make keys out of craft supplies, cookie dough, pancake batter, or bread dough.
- Have children to design a "chair" for St. Peter out of pantry supplies (cookies, crackers, nut butters, candies, pretzels, etc). Ideas here and here.
- For dinner, make <u>Baked Rockfish</u> in honor of Peter "the rock" (or any type of fish, since Peter was a fisherman!) Serve it alongside a "<u>Golden Chair of St. Peter fruit salad</u>"


