Letter from our Pastor

An Extraordinary Parish for Ordinary People

Dear Friends in Christ,

I try to be careful to distinguish in my preaching and teaching what is the teaching of the Church, what is theological opinion, and what is just my opinion. So what I am about to write is entirely my opinion, and you are entirely free to disagree! I've been thinking a lot about pro-life issues in the context of where we are as a society. We have spent a lot of time as citizens and as a Church trying to make abortion illegal. Now, this is not a bad thing. Many people assume that if something is legal, it is therefore morally good or at least neutral. To pretend that law should allow for the slaughter of the innocent is a violation of justice itself. But this mindset tends to see abortion as the problem, and making it illegal is what can solve the problem.

But shouldn't we work, not to make abortion un-legal, but un-thinkable? Is abortion not a problem but a symptom, a manifestation, of other problems? Is it not preferable to work towards a world in which fertility is celebrated as a good, and where young women are raised to be courageous and fearless instead of trapped in guilt and shame? No woman I have ever met who has had an abortion just woke up one day and decided to kill her baby. That fateful decision is at the end of a long journey that very often involves guilt, shame, self-image problems, abuse, anxiety and a sense of being unloved. At that end, there opens up a new beginning to a life that very often deepens those same dynamics. Maybe we should start looking at the beginning of the process rather than at the end?

When I see the beautiful young woman and girls at our parish, I want them to know that they are wonderfully made in the image and likeness of God, that they are worthy of love and respect, that their fertility and sexuality are gifts to be celebrated according to a divine plan of wisdom, that even their limitations, challenges and sins can be overcome with the help of God's love and a communion of faith. I want them to know that, but is that the message our young women (and men, too) are hearing, internalizing, and do they believe that message of hope and dignity? If that message becomes the driving force of their lives, will that not itself at least tend to move them away from the path that leads to abortion?

I think that it is still important to work to make abortion illegal, but I think it far more important to make it unthinkable. While we cannot hide or minimize the grisly reality of abortion, is it too naïve to hope that one day we won't have to remind people of what that looks like because they are too busy being reminded of the fact that they are beautiful in God's sight, and that's why they should not be afraid?

Likewise, as a Catholic I don't believe the State has the right to redefine marriage and rend asunder what God has joined together. When civil law sets itself up against divine law, we're headed for trouble. But shouldn't we also work to make sure that everyone understands the power of sacramental marriage? How can we have a community where divorce is unthinkable because marriages are strong, and when difficulties arise with couples, the Church is there not to condemn, but to heal? It's easier to outlaw abortion and divorce than it is to change the culture to transform it with the power of love lived in God's plan. But maybe it is our mission as the Church to be a part of the change we wish to see...

The obligation to observe, as a whole or "substantially," the penitential days specified by the Church is a serious obligation. The Code of Cannon Law states: "On these days (of Penance), the faithful are in a special manner to devote themselves to prayer, to engage in works of piety and charity, to deny themselves, by fulfilling theur obligations more faithfully and especially by observing the fast and abstinence..."

Celebrating the Liturgical Life of the Church

8 March: Feast of Saint John of God. {There are many saints named John; this particular saint has the title "of God." It was given to him by the Infant Jesus in a dream. A Spanish Bishop ordered John to bear this title once he knew of its divine origins.} For unknown reasons, John left his Portuguese home as a young child in the care of a priest and went to Spain. From there he lived an itinerant life as a farmer, shepherd, adventurer, and then soldier. At one point, the wandering John decided to ransom his freedom to North African Muslims in exchange for Christian hostages. The plan came to nothing and, upon the ad-



vice of a priest, he returned to Spain. At the lowest point of his aimless life, John had a breakthrough. Spiritual matters were of little importance until he heard Saint John of Ávila preach. It caused the wandering John to stop in his tracks. He fasted, he prayed, he went on pilgrimage. His conversion was so sincere, extreme and sudden that he was thought to be out of his mind. He was incarcerated in the Royal Hospital in Granada, and suffered the cruel treatment of the day for the mentally ill. Here he discovered how to show his love for God by caring for his fellow inpatients. He resolved to devote the rest of his life to people living on the margins of society. Upon release, John raised money to start a hospital and began to care for the sick and suffering. No one could match his level of care for patients and his reputation for holiness spread. He gave away his cloaks so often that his Bishop had a habit made, ordered John to put it on and not give it away. Once, a hospital fire broke out burning beyond control and no one dared enter the building. Patients who could stand were at windows crying for help. John rushed in and dragged or carried each person out. He saved many of their belongings and fought the fire himself. He escaped the inferno with only singed eyebrows. John's total dedication to the poor and sick drew many followers. They emulated his generosity, and soon an order was born. It was approved by the Holy See in 1572 under the title The Brothers Hospitallers of Saint John of God. They bind themselves by a fourth vow, the service of the sick. The Order spread quickly throughout the world. Its work for the poor continues today in hundreds of institutions. Saint John of God was also known for practicing a type of Ignatian spirituality in evaluating himself. He constantly examined himself, evaluated errors, listened to advice, stopped what he was doing and changed direction when needed. He cared little for his own physical health and died on his fifty-fifth birthday while kneeling in prayer before an altar in his room. In some saints there is a fine line between sanctity and madness. Saint John of God straddled that fine line. He became mad for the Lord and was canonized by the Church for his fervor in serving the poor and the God who loves them. Pope Leo XIII declared him Patron of Hospitals and Sick and placed his name in the Litanies of the Dying.

Ideas for celebrating this feast at home:

- Pray the Litany of St. John of God. Offer a mass or a rosary for the sick and suffering.
- Follow St. John's example and perform an <u>examination of conscience</u> (<u>here is one for children</u>). Go to confession and begin again on the path of holiness.
- St. John of God followed his impulses when it came to serving Christ. He acted immediately as the Holy Spirit led. Today, perform little heroic acts of charity, immediately as God inspires you.
- St. John of God always put others first. Consider: do I habitually give greater importance to others' needs before my own? Do I esteem myself over-highly, or do I consider myself of least importance?
- Send a letter, make a phone call, deliver a meal to someone who is sick or suffering in your community.
