Dear Friends in Christ,

I was here at Prince of Peace as a seminarian when the church was built, and was the Master of Ceremonies for the dedication. At that time, the concrete floor in the church was left unfinished and unstained. That decision was made in part because of the rush to get everything done before consecration day, and also because it was part of the aesthetic of the time to have raw materials look like what they are, a principle very much of the architects who built our church. But it also meant that it has for twenty years been virtually impossible to clean the floor, because raw concrete like a sidewalk can only be pressure washed, and you can't do that with wooden pews on top of them. Last year, we closed the church to get the transepts and the sanctuary done, and used that to address a number of other issues in the church. That was after closing the church for the lighting project as well.

The time has come to close the church again to do the nave floor, and to do a few maintenance projects in the sanctuary so the church can be looking its best for Holy Week. Today after the Noon Mass, the church will be closed until Friday, 8 April, when it will reopen for Stations of the Cross and Veneration of the Relic of the True Cross at 7p. Until then, we will have Daily Mass at St Rafka's, Confessions in the priests' offices at Parish House, and Stations on Friday will be outside, all at the regular times. This project is not really adding anything particularly aesthetically beautiful to the floors; it's literally just staining and sealing the concrete so we can actually clean it with a mop like any other surface on campus. It's a project 20 years overdue, and I'm glad we can get it done.

The noise, dust and smell mean that we cannot have Adoration in the Chapel. But we are keeping the Chapel open so, if you're brave enough to handle the mess in the church, you can still visit Our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament. We will have the Liturgy of the Hours in there, including Sunday Compline on Lent 4 and Lent 5. It's not ideal. I wish we could have had Daily Mass in the Chapel as well, but we have so many people coming for Daily Mass, that was impossible: that's a great problem/blessing to have.

Churches are living creatures in a sense; they grow with their communities. We have added a tremendous amount to the artistic patrimony of our church to the glory of God, and we're nowhere near done beautifying the House of God. When the Bicentennial Campaign is over, we can turn our eyes and ears to the next big projects for the church: re-upholstering the pews and kneelers, a real pipe organ, murals in the apse and the arches above the transepts, stained glass windows in the balcony and the transepts, and a bigger sacristy with an actual bathroom for the priests! It all takes time and money, and is all – thank God – in the future and not pressing needs right now. In the meantime, we can still add to the vestments and vessels and altar cloths and reliquaries that also beautify God's House and adorn our worship. Every centimeter of our church is an act of praise to God made possible by sacrificial generosity. This week's project may not be as colorful and comfortable as any of those that are still on our list, but it will certainly make it easier to clean the church. Twenty years of grime and gook are gone this week!

Celebrating the Liturgical Life of the Church

An Extraordinary Parish for Ordinary People

2 April: Feast of Saint Francis of Paola. Francis was born in the Southern region of Calabria, Italy during 1416. His parents were remarkable for their holiness and had a strong devotion to St. Francis of Assisi. As a child, Francis suffered a swelling that endangered his eyesight. His parents sought the intercession of St. Francis of Assisi and made a vow that their son should pass an entire year in the "little habit" of St Francis. The child was immediately cured. From his early years Francis showed signs of extraordinary sanctity. At thirteen, he entered a convent of the Franciscan Order to fulfill his parents' vow. He showed great love of prayer and mortification, profound humility, prompt obedience. After a year, Francis rejoined his parents for a pilgrimage to Assisi, Rome. When they returned to their hometown of Paola, he asked his parents' permission to live as a hermit. The young monk slept in a cave and ate what he could gather in the wild. Within four years, two companions joined him. Townspeople assisted in building little cells for the hermits, plus a chapel. The building of this 'monastery' caused great enthusiasm and devotion on the part



of the people: even nobles carried stones and joined in the work. Their devotion was increased by many miracles which the young saint wrought in answer to their prayers. With approval from the archbishop, this small group grew into a larger religious order. First known as the Hermits of St. Francis of Assisi, they were later renamed the "Minimi" (or "Minims"), meaning "the least," and signifying their commitment to humility – Francis wanted them to be the least in the household of God. Francis and his monks were notable for their primitive lifestyle and also for their strict diet, which eliminated meat, fish, eggs and dairy products. Abstinence from meat and animal products became a "fourth vow" of the religious order. Ironically, Francis' pursuit of solitary communion with God attracted attention from a range of important figures, including kings, Popes, bishops. They regarded Francis as a spiritual leader in a corrupt age. It was Francis's desire to be a hermit, yet he believed God was calling him to apostolic life. He began to use the gifts he had received (gifts of healing miracles and prophecy) for ministry. A defender of the poor and oppressed, Francis incurred the wrath of King Ferdinand of Naples for the admonitions he directed toward the king and his sons. At the request of Pope Sixtus IV, Francis traveled to Paris to help Louis XI prepare for death, taking along his nephew Nicholas, whom he had raised from the dead. Francis was able to influence the course of national politics. He helped restore peace between France and Brittany and between France and Spain. He founded new monasteries in France. He established convents of nuns, and a third order for people living in the world, after the example of St. Francis of Assisi. Francis sensed his death was approaching at age 91, and returned to complete solitude for three months to prepare. When he emerged, he gave the Minim brothers final instructions for the future of the order. He received Holy Communion and died on April 2, Good Friday of 1507. Pope Leo X canonized St. Francis of Paola in 1519. Although the Minim order lost many monasteries during the French Revolution, it continues to exist, primarily in Italy. Francis was named patron of Italian seamen in 1943 by Pope Pius XII because many miracles attributed to him were related to the sea.

Ideas for celebrating this feast at home:

- Make an extra Lenten sacrifice and refrain from eating meat, eggs, or dairy products today, just like the Minim friars. Renew your Lenten commitments to prayer, fasting, almsgiving.
- The friars were known for charitable work. As a family, pick a service project to do together.
- Make <u>Pasta with Sardines and Fennel</u>: the famous pasta con sarde (pasta with sardines) was the pride of Palermo's kitchens. The Minim friars had their own tricks to stretch food: their Paulota broth, distributed to beggars, relied on macaroni cooked in a pot in which fish, destined for more fortunate mouths, had been cooked. academic enrichment camp

The parish school is thrilled to once again offer a Summer Academic and Enrichment Camp for rising K5 through 8th grade students! This camp experience will target math and literacy skills and prepare students for a successful start next Fall. The academic program is driven from Achieve Literacy and Mathematics, as well as curricula from Prince of Peace. The enrichment programing is STEM Robotics driven from the Engineering Design Process.
