An Extraordinary Parish for Ordinary People

Dear Friends in Christ,

We're in the PAC this week for Mass, and there has been some grouching and complaining about not being in the church during Lent, and I get it, I really do. So, in true Lenten fashion, I tell you (and me): Offer it up! So why did we schedule the work when we did? This is easy: we have so many weddings coming up, that it would be almost 2023 before we had a window of time to do the work in the time we needed to do it. Weddings are not solemnized in the penitential seasons, so it's now or never.

It's an opportunity on this Passion Sunday to remember that not everyone gets to worship in a big, clean, beautiful and safe church building. As Russia invaded Ukraine, Christians had to abandon centuries old works of art to gather for Holy Mass in underground bunkers to escape obliteration. War has destroyed priceless works of art given by sacrifices of ordinary people to lift people's souls to divine things and to Divinity Himself.

When I was living in Turkey last summer, I was amazed by how the Holy Land of the Church, where the first seven ecumenical councils were held, where the seven churches of the Book of Revelation are found, an area with a church on every corner: now, most of the few churches that are not in ruins are mosques. Again, war succeeded in snuffing out the presence of Christ as His Passion was renewed by people killing each other in the Name of God.

But even as you kneel on the gym floor today and not in our parish church, give thanks to God that we are at least now still free to worship God in spirit and in truth. Holy Week is coming, and the magnificent ceremonies of the Church will unfold as they have for centuries as we gather to commemorate the Passion, Death and Resurrection of Our Lord.

A letter from Fr Joshua J Whitfield of St Rita Catholic Church in Dallas, Texas

Occasionally a person, often a parent, will come to me, expressing a desire to deepen his or her Christian life—finally take it seriously, be more intentional. The desire is real, genuine, beautiful. For better or worse, they come to me for advice.

But then I tell them simply to go to confession, pray daily, read the Bible, and stop treating youth sports like a religion; and then I tell them never ever miss Sunday Mass. Often, that's when I lose them, for they weren't looking for that.

Looking for what? I don't know. Mostly, I think they're after a feeling, maybe a perspective, a devotion—something tinged with sentimentality, nothing that calls into question practices, habits, the forms of life, ethics; nothing like repentance and change.

Which is where so many of us are, where we're stuck. And it's also why Catholicism seems repeatedly to underdeliver. But it's not Catholicism. It's us.

So often we're like Naaman, not listening to Elisha; we don't take the simple advice. Catholicism is no gimmick, no perspective or feeling. It's salvation and the daily work of holiness. It doesn't conform to your expectations. It never will.

Which is why if you want real Catholicism, work at it. Show up, change your habits, live the precepts of the Church. It's not complicated or sexy or trendy. It's just daily work, sacred habits, piety in stability. Anyone telling you anything else is selling you something.


So, if you want truly freeing Catholicism, the sort that changes your life, don't chase after gimmicks or feelings. Just get to Mass; live the sacraments; let the timing and shape of liturgies shape your life. Do it until it becomes habit, the spiritual structure of your being.

Then you'll be free. Then the noise and nonsense of the world, and even a lot of the noise and nonsense in the Church, will simply hush. And then you will find your God—in stillness.

But you can't just claim it, buy it like some Amazon order. Because although it's free, it's costly. You have to shape and form your desire, a desire ready for God. Which is what religion is all about. Real practiced religion, that is—a rare find. Look for it. It's close.



Celebrating the Liturgical Life of the Church

An Extraordinary Parish for Ordinary People



5 April: Feast of Saint Juliana de Cornillon, also known as St Juliana of Liège. Juliana was born near Liège, Belgium around 1191. Orphaned at the age of five, Juliana, together with her sister Agnes, was entrusted to the care of the Augustinian nuns at the convent of Mont-Cornillon. She was taught mainly by a sister called “Sapienza” [wisdom], who was in charge of her spiritual development to the time Juliana received the religious habit and thus became an Augustinian nun. She became so learned that she could read the words of the Church Fathers, of St. Augustine and St. Bernard in particular, in Latin. In addition to a keen intelligence, Juliana showed a special propensity for contemplation. She had a profound sense of Christ’s presence, which she experienced by living the Sacrament of the Eucharist especially intensely and by pausing frequently to meditate upon Jesus’ words: “And lo, I am with you always, to the close of the age” (Mt 28:20). At age 16, Juliana had her first vision which reoccurred several times during her Eucharistic adoration.

Her vision was of the moon in its full splendor, crossed diametrically by a dark stripe. The Lord gave her understanding of the vision. The moon symbolized the life of the Church on earth, the opaque line represented the absence of a liturgical feast for whose institution Juliana was asked to plead effectively: namely, a feast in which believers would be able to adore the Eucharist so as to increase in faith, to advance in the practice of the virtues and to make reparation for offences to the Most Holy Sacrament. Juliana, who had become Prioress of the convent, kept this revelation a secret for about 20 years. She then confided it to two other fervent adorers of the Eucharist, Blessed Eva, who lived as a hermit, and Isabella, who had joined her at the Monastery of Mont-Cornillon. The three women established a sort of “spiritual alliance” for the purpose of glorifying the Most Holy Sacrament. They also chose to involve a highly regarded Priest, John of Lausanne. They asked him to consult theologians and clerics on their behalf. Their affirmative responses were encouraging. Juliana faithfully immersed herself in prayer, waited patiently, sought friendship with other good souls and submitted all things to the judgement of the Pastors of the Church. Bishop Robert Torote of Liège, after initial hesitation, eventually accepted the proposal of Juliana and her companions and first introduced the Solemnity of Corpus Christi in his diocese. Later, other Bishops followed his example and instituted this Feast in their territories. However, Juliana also had to bear harsh criticism and opposition from members of the clergy and even of the superior on whom her monastery depended. Of her own free will, therefore, Juliana left the Convent of Mont-Cornillon with several companions. For 10 years she stayed as a guest at various monasteries of Cistercian sisters. She was known for her humility, she had no words of criticism or reproach for her adversaries, and she continued zealously to spread Eucharistic worship. She died at Fosses-La-Ville, Belgium, in 1258. In the cell where she lay, the Blessed Sacrament was exposed. Juliana died contemplating lovingly Jesus in the Eucharist whom she had always loved, honored and adored. Jacques Pantaléon of Troyes was also won over to the good cause of the Feast of Corpus Christi during his ministry as Archdeacon in Liège. It was he who, having become Pope with the name of Urban IV in 1264, instituted the Solemnity of Corpus Christi on the Thursday after Pentecost as a feast of precept for the universal Church. —Excerpted from Pope Benedict XVI *General Audience* of November 17, 2010.

academic enrichment camp
