Excerpt from Fr Smith's 2017 Easter Homily

An Extraordinary Parish for Ordinary People

In the Book of Exodus the Chosen People are held in bondage in Egypt, until an angel passes over the houses where the lintels were marked with the blood of a lamb, and the Jews began their mighty escape as their captors were put to confusion at the sudden death of their children. As soon as that avenging angel passed over those houses, the Israelites began to pass over from slavery to freedom, crossing the Red Sea and marching over to the land of milk and honey. God decided to intervene in human affairs to free one race of people. But that was a foreshadowing of an even greater liberation, a more dramatic passing over. Because in the fullness of time, God becomes one of us, like in all things but sin. And then, in the ultimate proof of His love, He took our sins upon Himself. He was both the priest who offered himself to the father in our place, and the victim that was sacrificed.

How could we not watch on this Good and Holy Friday as the Savior hung on the Cross? We knew the words of the Lord, *Greater love has no man than He lay down His life for His friends.* We can honor such a total self-giving. But is there not a little bit of an unbeliever in us all, who looks at the dying Jesus and says, *If He be the King of Israel, let Him come down from the Cross and we will believe Him.* Yet, had He yielded to those insults, how would He ever have taught us that patience which brings us all good things? He waited for a little while longer, bore more outrages, and sub-



mitted to mockery. But it was a far greater thing for Him to rise from the dead than it would have been to come down from the Cross which was the instrument that proved His total self-gift for us.

Yet, the women who had followed Him in His public life did not know that He had already risen when they went to the borrowed tomb, bringing with them sweet spices. Those spices were more than just a traditional burial custom for a man they loved; they were signs of the perfume of their holiness: their virtue in good works animated by faith and compassion meant that they saw angels at the tomb. They were given a glimpse beyond the pain and suffering of the last days of their beloved friend to citizens of heaven itself. He is not here; He is risen. The angel announces tidings of great joy, for heaven would now be open not merely to angels, bit once again to all of the children of Adam and Eve.

For this time, there was no avenging angel ignoring blood of animals, but God Himself, the Messenger of Mercy, the lamb of God who took away the sins of the world. He passed over from death to life, and not merely from slavery to freedom. He goes before you into Galilee, and there you shall Him, as He told you. St Gregory the Great reminds us that Galilee means "passing-over," and so Jesus passes over from the city of His death into a new country, and from there to heaven itself. The angels guarded the earthly paradise of Eden when Adam and Eve were expelled in their shame. Now, Christ, the Anointed One, opens the gates to the eternal paradise of heaven, where there is no more guilt, and there can never be any more shame.

The men and women who have come into full communion with the Catholic Church this Easter, all around the world, are signed with the blood the Lamb, by the sprinkling of that water which purifies them and makes them irrevocably children of God. They have been signed, sealed and delivered with the anointing of the Holy Spirit and sent out as angels themselves with this credible message of mercy to the world. They have passed over from this world to the next, and now are found worthy to feast at the sacred banquet of heaven, anticipated in this world under the sacramental signs of bread and wine. The Body offered up for them on the Cross, every drop of blood shed for them on Calvary, is their true meat and their true drink, but that Body is not glorious and risen, and their bodies and souls will also, on the last day be called to be glorious and risen as well.


