

Letter from our Pastor

An Extraordinary Parish for Ordinary People

Dear Friends in Christ,

In the not too distant past, Catholic parishes ran like this: Father lived in a rectory on campus with one or more assistant priests and a housekeeper and a cook took care of their physical needs so they could take care of their people's spiritual needs. There might be a porter at the rectory door who took Mass intentions and answered the phone. Mother Superior lived in a convent on the property and the nuns ran the school. Social events happened as the priests, nuns and laypeople all pitched in together to make them happen.

There are still people who live in a fantasy land that Catholic churches still work like this. I confess that, if it were up to me, I would love to restore that model of parish. After Vatican II, American parishes started to involve the laity in the ministry of the parish, which was a good thing. People's expectations of what the parish was to provide increased, and many parishes began to model their lives on Protestant megachurches. What did not change, however, is a proportionate increase in time, talent and treasure. So many parishes have tried to make this model work by shoehorning an antiquated model of parish sustenance into a much different model of ministry and administration.

In many Protestant churches, the head pastor is the highest paid member of staff and paid a competitive salary to attract the right person. The pastor is helped by an army of paid staff and volunteers. Church members know that they have to give their time, talent and treasure for their church to survive. In Catholic churches, the pastor is actually the lowest paid member of staff and is assigned by the Bishop. Yet he has become less a pastor of souls and more the CEO of a mid-size corporation who has to manage staff and volunteers to keep people thinking their church is vibrant and worth going to. And if Catholics don't like what they see in one parish, they just hop to another one and another one until they get what they want.

Now, being a convert from Protestantism, I actually see great value in much of what the mega-parish model provides for the Christian life. But I am also aware that it requires a very real set of circumstances to function. Father cannot be CEO, chief cook and bottlewasher, the man who opens and closes every building, is on call at the drop of a hat for every single thing, and still survive unscathed. I have read recently of studies that Protestant ministers are abandoning their calling in surprising numbers because of the psychological toll that they are experiencing. Catholic priests in general are actually, according to the studies I am reading, happy with their vocations, but they are increasingly unhealthy and exhausted as they to minister within the contemporary context of the Church's life.

Sociologists talk about the 80/20 rule, that 20% of people in an organization do 80% of the work. What we are seeing at Prince of Peace is that, those who are giving their time and talent are getting overextended. Even expanding our staff hasn't entirely relieved the burden on those you pay to keep the church going. I invite the 80% of those who call Prince of Peace their spiritual home who are not yet helping with their work to please consider two things: signing up for Adoration and being a part of one ministry, council or event. That culture change would be radical for allowing the parish to do well all of the things that you expect of a parish.

I also want those who are newer to the parish to look at their treasure. If the parish budget increased by 20%, which would mean an increase of \$5200 a week in offertory, we could do two very important things for the life of the parish: first, we can actually pay our salaried workers more what they are worth and actually respect the social teaching of the Church for their remuneration; second, we could hire more people for events coordination and maintenance, communication and IT work that is now being done by volunteers who are doing an amazing job, but seriously overextended trying to provide for the parish at cost to their families and employment. With 1800 families in the parish, that increase works out to \$3 a week. I mean, you can't even get a coffee at Starbucks for that. I challenge every family to try to add that \$3 to their weekly offertory, and we will be able to see some significant results.


