

Letter from our Pastor

An Extraordinary Parish for Ordinary People

Dear Friends in Christ,

When I was discerning my vocation as a college student, I was attracted to religious life. I wanted to find a community with a rich liturgical life, a commitment to the search for holiness, parish ministry and active missionary efforts. There are a number of growing communities in the church like this, and I enjoyed my time among them. But as an only child, I also had an obligation to take care of my parents which I could not hand over to anyone else. So that restricted my freedom to choose religious life, and Providence guided me to become a secular priest in the Diocese of Charleston. I absolutely love being a diocesan priest, and Prince of Peace is such an amazing parish that I can't imagine being anywhere else.

During my sabbatical, however, besides studying and traveling, I had to come to terms with what my future might look like. The passing of my dear father meant that I was once again free to discern another form of religious life. My dream of missionary work never died, and, as I am sure those of you who read of my sabbatical in the bulletin column will not be surprised to read, the thought of missionary priesthood in Turkey got a hold of me. I spoke at length with my spiritual director about this and sought counsel from bishops, diplomats and friends. But at a certain point, I had to bring this desire in my heart that I couldn't get rid of to my superiors.

At the beginning of Lent, I sat down with Bishop Guglielmone as the Apostolic Administrator and asked for his advice. He actually encouraged me to explore this option more. Part of me wanted him to just shut it down entirely so I could seek refuge in obedience to set aside that desire. But I also spoke to him of the fact that I also did not want to leave Prince of Peace or the Diocese of Charleston.

My sabbatical stay in Turkey was informal as far as my ministry was concerned. After discussions with our diocese and the new bishop of the Apostolic Vicariate of Istanbul, I was given permission to go back to Turkey for six weeks in the summer for a more formal relationship with the Church in Turkey. I will take up once again Turkish language lessons and be available for supply work during the summer for the clergy there. This is a unique opportunity to see the reality of missionary life more from the inside. The obstacles of an American priest actually making permanent residence as a missionary in Turkey are quite considerable, but that doesn't preclude some very small contribution to the cause of keeping the flame of the Gospel alive in what has been called the Holy Land of the Church.

I am only able to do this because of the extraordinary generosity of Father Tomlinson, whose support and encouragement alone make this possible. The staff and the deacons have stepped up to also make sure that in my summer absence to do missionary work, the life of the parish as we know it will continue. Don't worry, I'm only gone from I7 June to I August, so by the time you all get back from summer vacation, you will never know I was gone. I ask for your prayers, especially for my protection. While I think that the possibility of physical danger is remote, and Turkey is one of the more stable countries in that part of the world, it is still the Middle East, and as a Christian and as a priest, events can change very quickly. I also have to thank you as a parish for your support during this time. You are making the sacrifice of your parish priest to the life of the missions. Even though it's only for a short time this year, it is still a genuine sacrifice. May the generosity with which you make this sacrifice be rewarded both in Turkey and here!

4 may: feast of saint florian of lorch

Florian was born around 250 AD in the Roman city of Aelium Cetiumin (present-day Sankt Pölten, Austria). He joined the Roman army as a young man and advanced quickly through the ranks, rising to commander of the imperial army in the province of Noricum. In addition to military duties, he was also given the responsibility of leading men to fight fires. Florian saw the need to organize permanent firefighting brigades; he trained elite groups of soldiers whose sole duty was to fight fires. During the Diocletianic Persecution of Christians, reports reached Rome that Florian was refusing to kill Christians in his province. Diocletian sent Governor Aquilinus to investigate; the suspicion was that Florian was refusing to carry out executions because he, too, was a Christian. To test his faith, Aquilinus ordered Florian to offer a sacrifice to the Roman gods. Florian refused. Florian was offered greater pay and more power if he would abandon Christianity. But Florian stood firm in his refusal. Enraged, Aquilinus ordered Florian to be brutally beaten. Florian boldly declared, "Tell the Emperor that I am a Christian and will suffer the same fate as the Christians." After he was beaten, Aquilinus ordered Florian to be burned. Florian's own soldiers were commanded to burn him at the stake. His friends hesitated, but as he stood on the funeral pyre, Florian encouraged them to be brave and light the fire: "If you do, I will climb to Heaven on the flames!" Aquilinus overheard and decided against burning. Instead, he had Florian flayed, beaten again, and then drowned by tying a millstone around his neck and throwing him into the River Enns. Florian's body was recovered and buried by a faithful Christian.

Ideas for celebrating this feast at home:

- Decorate your dinner table with red, the color of martyrs. Enjoy an Austrian or Polish meal. Since St. Florian is also the patron of brewers, enjoy a good brew tonight in his honor.
- Visit your local fire station and deliver treats and thank you's. Say this prayer to St. Florian for firefighters.
- Celebrate St. Florian's feast day with a FIRE! Light up the fireplace or build a big backyard bonfire. Roast marshmallows. Sit by the fire telling stories of the saints and tell children what it means to be a martyr and why we must all be ready to die for our Faith.

fr smith mission work in turkey

With the support & encouragement of Bishop Guglielmone and Bishop-Elect Fabre, Fr Smith will complete mission work and Turkish studies in Istanbul starting 17 June and returning on 1 August.

- Fr Smith is not leaving his position as pastor and will return on I August to our parish.
- Mission work is not to be confused with a sabbatical or vacation.
- Our Mass schedule during this time will be the normal Summer Schedule that occurs every year (I daily OF Mass at 7a, no Saturday daily Mass except for 1st Saturday EF Mass at 8a & normal Sunday schedule)
- Fr Smith asks for your prayers that he may continue to discern the Lord's will to be a man of communion and encounter in a land blessed by God.
