Letter from our Pastor

## An Extraordinary Parish for Ordinary People

Dear Friends in Christ,

We often talk about how being pro-life is much more than just being against abortion. Sometimes faithful Catholics extend that to being against artificial contraception or euthanasia, or fighting what St John Paul II called "the culture of death" in the public square by challenging political and legal trends against life. And all of that is well and good. But creating a culture of life and a civilization of life is more than that. It means celebrating life as a gift from God at every moment, of seeing fertility as a positive thing to be enjoyed rather than regulated or frustrated; it means preaching the Good News about sex, marriage and family life that the virtue of purity is more than just not doing certain things with our body parts. Purity is about single-mindedly following the God of Love.

Prevention of abortion has to mean more than merely making people aware of the horrible reality of abortion, although that is absolutely necessary when so many turn a blind eye to its reality. We have to break the cycles of poverty, discrimination, prejudice; we have to break the cycles of mental, physical and sexual abuse that turn good little boys and girls into shadows of their true selves. We have to encourage good psychological counseling, excellent spiritual direction and superlative moral character formation. When, as a Church and as men and women of good will we really do everything we can to foster a culture in which those things are normative, and not clean up after crisis, I am absolutely convinced we will see abortion become less of a temptation and healing in people's lives.

I once had a catechist in a former parish tell me that in decades of teaching first graders at CCD, what she focused on the most was this simple lesson: *I am loved*. As a young seminarian hearing this the first time, and learning about the crisis in contemporary catechesis leaving generations without the true faith, I scoffed. After almost seventeen years of priestly ministry, I can absolutely tell you without a second thought that the simple truth *I am loved* is at the root of everything from divine revelation to happiness in this life. The entire history of salvation and the authentic meaning of human life is a commentary on this great truth: *I am loved*.

When we lose sight of that fact, or we substitute false loves from false gods for it, when we never really internalize that truth because of difficulties especially in childhood, but also in marriages, it wreaks havoc not only on our souls, but on all of those around us, and can have effects for generations to come. We don't sin because we hate God, more than not, we lose grace because we despair that we are loved. And the reconciliation that comes from the Precious Blood shed on the Cross and poured out on us in abundance with the Holy Ghost in Baptism, Confirmation and the Eucharist: it gives us a love that is stronger than death.

My friends, even in our own community, practicing Catholics are not immune from the assaults of the Evil One. The Devil, like a roaring lion seeking whom he may devour, is sifting us like wheat. Family divisions, mental health breakdowns, identity confusion, apostasy from the true religion is affecting those who call Prince of Peace their spiritual home as much as anyone else. So what is our response to what seems like an overwhelming tsunami and sin and its consequences?

Today in the Hallmark Calendar of American civil society is a day which we are right even as Christians to be a part of: Mothers' Day. Whether you are celebrating your mom today, remembering her fondly, or recovering from her: the lesson of today includes the secret to restoring everything: a Mother's Love made it possible for paradise to be reopened, and for our sins, although they may be as scarlet, to be washed away so that we are as white as snow. Let's celebrate that Mary our Queen shows us the way forward to glory.

#### about the altar

The central focus of the liturgical action of the Mass is the altar of sacrifice where the sacrifice of redemption is renewed. Here, the bloody total self-gift of lesus to His Father in the unity of the Holy Spirit on Golgotha is made present to us in an unbloody manner under the sacramental veils of bread and wine, as we share the fruits of that one sacrifice in Holy Communion. Ordinarily, the altar is made of stone, and has five crosses engraved into it, which represent the fie wounds of Our Lord on the Cross. Towards the front of the altar, or in the pedestal of the altar, are buried the relics of saints and martyrs who gave their lives for Christ. In our altar, we have the relics of Ss. Linus and Callistus, two of the successors of St Peter as Pope, as well as St Pius X and St Elizabeth Ann Seton, our first American saints. On top of the altar are three cloths, which recall the cloths in which Our Lord was swathed in the manger in Bethlehem, the binding cloths which held Him in the tomb and the cloth that was placed over His Holy Face in that sepul-The stone slab of the altar represents the chre. anointing stone and the altar itself the tomb. Before an altar is set apart for divine worship, the Bishop anoints it with sacred chrism and burns incense upon it to remind us that here we worship Christ - the Anointed One – and that our prayers rise to heaven as sweet perfume before the Lord, in union with the prayers of all the saints and angels in heaven who constantly minister at the throne of Grace.

Also on top of the altar is found at its center an image of the Crucified Lord, to remind us that at Mass we stand at Calvary. Six candles surround the Cross, all images of the light that comes from the Resurrection so that the altar is ablaze with the light of glory. On

solemnities and feasts, the altar may be further adorned with flowers or with the relics of the saints to add to the Church a greater sense of joy. The candles are ordinarily of beeswax, and are unbleached during the penitential seasons of Advent and Lent, and bleached particularly when the Blessed Sacrament is exposed for adoration.
