Letter from our Pastor

An Extraordinary Parish for Ordinary People

Dear Friends in Christ,

Today I will celebrate Mass in Portuguese for the first time, so pray that my guardian angels can translate so I don't massacre this fascinating language too much. I can read and understand the language relatively well, but conversing fluently in it is another hurdle. One of the reasons we are doing this is to see exactly what the pastoral need is for the rapidly increasing numbers of Brazilian and Portuguese families in the area, and in our parish. Now, that doesn't mean that the parish or I am going to ful-fill those needs regularly, but it will be interesting to see how it goes.

Sometimes I hear people say, "Why can't they just learn English?" Well, you might be surprised, but the first generation of immigrants often do learn a lot of English, and the second generation tends to be fluent in English and forgetful of the language of their parents, and the Americanised third generation often wishes they could have been raised in both languages. It is a natural process. But there is something really comforting about being able to pray in our mother tongue, especially when we want to go to confession! When I hear that question above, at times I will retort, "Well, why can't you just learn Latin then?" Latin is the official language of the Catholic church. Jews all over the world learn their prayers in Hebrew, Muslims say their prayers in Arabic, and many other religions have a sacred language that is used for prayer and scripture reading. Even Jesus grew up speaking Aramaic, but prayed in Hebrew. Latin is part of our cultural and spiritual heritage as Catholics.

Narrow-minded jingoistic xenophobia is not Catholic. It's good to be proud of your own culture, language and country. But the Latin character of Catholicism is a powerful antidote to nationalisms that often turn into violent totalitarianisms. Civil states have the right to make prudent laws about migration, but in the Church all are welcome, regardless of the status of their passport or visa.

In some parts of the world, language plays into politics in a way we can't imagine. Think of the sheer number of languages that are spoken on the Indian Subcontinent or in Southeast Asia. Latin provides a common language for Catholics that transcends any form of tribalism. As the Church opened its sacred rites to the vernacular in the 1960s, it was always with the caveat that it wasn't English or Latin, but English and Latin, and a whole host of other languages besides. It is part of the beautiful creativity of the Church as a vehicle for pastoral sensitivity that Catholicism permeates, elevates and transforms human culture. Being fluent in our mother tongue, Latin and in whatever other languages are present in our current time and space may mean some time, talent and treasure is expensed to get there, but it reaps rewards of greater humanity and more excellent sacrality.

Every once in a while I come across someone who has a disproportionately violent reaction to Latin in the liturgy. I am always reminded of the well documented fact among exorcists that the Devil hates Latin. I'm not sure I can explain why, but you are free to talk to Satan about that on your own time. I'm just going to trust the exorcists on this one. We should never be afraid, much less nasty, about what the Church employs for her sacred worship, whether it be Latin or Laz, Greek or German. The Word made flesh and dwelt among us, and the extension of the Word Incarnate, the Church, invests words with meaning and power. Let's use them all with devotion and reverence.







the priest prepares for mass

Whenever the priest goes to celebrate Mass, he prepares for prayer – with prayer. He places himself in the presence of Almighty God, and calls to mind the specific intention for which he is going to celebrate Mass. Although they are optional now, it was common for the priest to pray a number of psalms and prayers to remind him of the sacredness of this action and how unworthy he is to minister at the altar. When he is ready, he enters the sacristy, the room of preparations for sacred worship. He washes his hands, and prays, Give strength to my hands, Lord, to wipe away all stain, so that I may be able to serve Thee in purity of mind and body. The priest of the New Covenant is the inheritor of the fulfillment of the sacrifices of the Old Law, and so he washes his hands before offering the sacrifice just as the lewish priests

and levites performed purification rituals with water before this work offered on behalf of the people, which is what the Greek word liturgy means.

The priest is now in his black cassock, that anklelength garment whose black color symbolizes death to the world. The cassock ordinarily has thirty three buttons down the front, one for each of the years Our Lord spent on earth, and five buttons on the sleeves, for each of the five wounds of Christ on the Cross. The cassock is a reminder that the priest must put sin to death so that Christ can live through him. It can be



replaced by white in tropical climates, and is purple for bishops, the ancient sign of royal leadership, and scarlet for cardinals, for the call to martyrdom and the guidance of the Holy Spirit.

In next week's bulletin, we'll continue the priest's preparation for Mass.


