Letter from our Pastor

An Extraordinary Parish for Ordinary People

Dear Friends in Christ,

Like many Americans growing up, food for me was just a vehicle for what was absolutely necessary for survival, and that often came in the guise of fast food eaten quickly on the run. When I became a Catholic, I was so edified by the stories of the saints whose ascetical feats seemed like the best diet plan ever, that it never occurred to me that good Christians were supposed to eat and enjoy it. When I went to Europe, and began to absorb Catholic culture, it was a shock to my Puritanical attitude toward food and drink. Hilaire Belloc, the famous writer, put it best: "Wherever a Catholic sun doth shine, there's always laughter and good red wine. At least I've ever found it so, Benedicamus Domino!" It reminded me of an episode from the Simpsons which contrasted Protestant Heaven with Catholic Heaven. It was a parody, of course, but it made it seem like Protestant Heaven was just boring, while the Catholics were having a grand old time up beyond the pearly gates. Of course, there is only one heaven (the real one), and it is neither of those things: it is the beatific vision, an eternal act of worship.

But either way, food and drink are part of our Catholic culture. In religious houses, there are two sayings: *Ubi Missa, ibi mensa* – where there's Mass, there's table; and "The Refectory is an extension of the Sanctuary." The sacred banquet of the Eucharist is prepared for with fasting, and given thanks for by sharing fellowship around food and drink. Now, can this get unbalanced and out of hand? Well, even St Paul had to admonish the Corinthians for partying before Mass and showing up to the service drunk, so this is nothing new. But when we bring the virtues of temperance and moderation to what we eat and drink, and seek to bring beauty and goodness to how we eat and drink, the love feast of the Eucharist extends into the love feast of meals shared together. The domestic church can mimic the ceremonial of the Mass by making the family table a place of beauty. Just as the Church is visibly different on a fast day of Lent than it is on Easter Sunday, how does your table look and feel different on those days? Flowers, china, silver, linen and crystal may not be appropriate for every day, and not everyone can enjoy these things, but they certainly have their place.

Do you invite people over to your domestic church home to share a meal? Often young adults and older people share a pew with you alone by themselves for Mass and then eat alone afterwards. A community of faith should be mindful of those people, too. Extend an invite! A Catholic culture of food and drink, fasting and feasting, is also a powerful instrument for evangelization and keeping people connected to the community. Foodie-ism has become a poor substitute for religion, but it can also be a point of contact. We can witness to the true religion by involving others in our domestic church celebration of both the sacred year and shared food.

Cooking, setting a table, serving at meals and cleaning up afterwards, are all life skills. Dining etiquette may be just a convention of cultural norms, but it is also a sign of respect. Some of our children are growing up without these useful life skills and character formation. I get so sad when I see an entire family around a table, or a couple in a restaurant, not talking to each other and just staring at their phones the whole time. I'm guilty of it as well, but Catholic counter-cultural resistance isn't just about preferring Sunday to soccer. It even includes things like, you know, the sacred art of conversation!



the priest prepares for mass (cont. from last week)

The priest then puts on each of the sacred vestments the Church prescribes for her sacred ministers when they celebrate Holy Mass. These vestments are the continuation of both lewish and pagan ceremonial dress, to underscore the continuity of Catholic worship with the liturgy of ancient Israel and the virtue of natural religion. The inner vestments are ordinarily of linen, but also now are often made in cotton or various blends. They are white, to symbolize the purity of the baptized soul in Christ. Over them, are the outer vestments specific to the day, and are ordinarily of silk or some other precious material, as is befitting the dignity of our royal service to the King of Kings. These vestments come in colors which have been associated since ancient times with various aspects of Christian life. Green during the ordinary time after Epiphany and Pentecost indicates growth, just as so many living things in the world are green. Red is for the blood of martyrdom and the fire of the Holy Spirit come down upon the Apostles at Pentecost. Purple is the ancient sign of both royalty but also of penance, as it is close to black, the color of mourning. At the midway points of Advent and Lent, purple is muted to joyful rose in expectation of the coming feasts of Christmas and Easter. White is the color of feasting and purity, for the greatest solemnities and memorials of the saints, and can be replaced by cloth of gold or silver.

The first inner vestment the priest puts on is the amice. He kisses the cross on it as a sign of reverence and places it momentarily over his head before resting it on the shoulders to protect the other vestments from his own sweat! It is fastened around him with white or red ribbons, and comes from the Latin word, amictus,



which means to wrap around. As he dons the vestment, he prays that he may be protected from the assaults of the Evil One, whose dominion was destroyed by the reality the Mass commemorates. He prays, Lord, set the helmet of salvation upon my head, to fend off all the assaults of the devil.

On these days, a minor rogation procession will begin the 12n EF Mass.


