Letter from our Pastor

An Extraordinary Parish for Ordinary People

Dear Friends in Christ.

It's hard to know where you're going if you don't know where you came from. And if you want to avoid making mistakes in the future, it's a good idea to study the past so you can learn from other's errors what not to do, which sometimes is just as important as knowing what to do. History as a discipline has been eviscerated in many academic settings as merely a part of the innocuously termed "social studies," which seem awfully malleable to whatever manipulations politics of the moment want to give it. While some may argue that no history is ever objective because it is written by people, history does seek to document events. The narrative by which history is told, however, says a lot about how the narrative was crafted, and the presuppositions and agendas of those who construct the narrative. To ascertain the quality and relevance of such a narrative, it is important to know that.

In 2020, Sister Pam Smith, who has worked in the Diocese of Charleston for many years, published *State of Grace*, the newest history of Catholicism in South Carolina. It was the first such history since Msgr Richard Madden's in 1984, which in turn was an update of Fr O'Connell's 1879 history. This newest book was an interesting tour de force of the characters and events that make our own local Catholic history so fascinating. Of course, one cannot write about Southern history honestly without reference to slavery and racism, which are part of that story. But *State of Grace* seems to be a history of the diocese through the lens of race being the fundamental category through which everything in our history is to be viewed. That is regrettable, because it flattens out people and events which are much more multi-faceted and gives, to an otherwise remarkable book, a lamentable poverty of narrative.

That is why I was intrigued when a parishioner gave me a copy of Adam Tate's Catholics' Lost Cause: South Carolina Catholics and the American South 1820-1861. This book, published in 2018, does not ignore questions of race and slavery in telling the story. But it presents the history of Catholicism in this state in a wider context. What did Catholics believe about their faith and how did they try to build the Church in the time and place that they lived? The book asserts, "South Carolina Catholic leadership failed to maintain an independent course, eventually capitulating to the position of the dominant culture in which they lived," when it came to questions of race and slavery. But the book presents this assertion amidst a deep dive into the questions of evangelization, apologetics, ecumenism and administration, in concert with the broader intellectual history of the period. Both Sr Pam and Tate's books are useful for learning about the past.

But South Carolina Catholicism is making history now. The appointment of Bishop Jacques Fabre-Jeune as the fourteenth Bishop of Charleston is unique in many ways. He is the first Haitian-American to be made a bishop, and the first Black prelate in South Carolina. As a member of the Scalabrinian Missionary Order, he has spent much of his priesthood in ministry with Spanish-speaking Catholics. In many ways, this appointment is prophetic, because it is an indication of how the demographics of Catholics in our state are changing. He also presents in his very own person a powerful opportunity for reconciliation of the past and charting course for the future. Previous Bishops of Charleston were slaveholders; the current Ordinary of the Holy City is a testimony to the Church's emerging from that past to a more equitable human and a more authentically Christian future. And that is no bad thing.

As a Church we will continue to build the Kingdom of God, but we also do so with imperfect human vessels to do it. Just as the Catholics in South Carolina in the 19th century were limited by their cultural and environmental prejudices, we are too. But we can move forward, led by the Spirit, to do good things here and now.



the priest prepares for mass (cont. from last week)

Over the amice he places the alb, which comes from the Latin alba, meaning white. It calls to mind the white garment with which we are clothed in baptism, where we are covered by Christ: though your sins may be as scarlet they are now as white as snow. The alb comes from the Roman toga, the garment proper to scholars. It is appropriate for the priest to wear this garment, as he is enlightened by sacred truth and commanded to teach it. The priest prays, Make me white, O Lord and cleanse my heart, that being made white with the Blood of the Lamb, I may deserve an eternal reward.

The priest than gathers the vestments together with a braided cord of linen called the *cincture*, which is wrapped tightly around the priest's waist to remind him of the virtue of chastity. *Gird me O Lord with the cincture of purity, and quench in my heart the fire of concupiscence, that the virtue of continence and chastity may abide in me.* The cincture can be white or colored.

The priest then places on his left wrist the maniple, the first of the outer vestments the color of the day. The word *manipulum* in Latin means a sheaf of grain, or something carried in a small bundle. It is the remnant of a larger more ancient vestment that included a handkerchief to wipe away sweat and tears from the priest's face at Mass. He prays, *May I deserve*, *O Lord*, to bear the maniple of weeping and sorrow in order that I

may joyfully reap the rewards of my labors. It is a reminder that Christian life in this valley of tears is not our true home, and can be a place of suffering, where the priest in the person of Christ must work hard to show souls beyond the Cross to the Resurrection.

In next week's bulletin, we'll continue the priest's preparation for Mass.


