Dear Fellow Parishioners,

At World Youth Day in 2000, Saint John Paul the Great said to young people from all over the world:

"It is Jesus that you seek when you dream of happiness; He is waiting for you when nothing else you find satisfies you; He is the beauty to which you are so attracted; it is He who provoked you with that thirst for fullness that will not let you settle for compromise; it is He who urges you to shed the masks of a false life; it is He who reads in your heart your most genuine choices, the choices that others try to stifle.

It is Jesus who stirs in you the desire to do something great with your lives, the will to follow an ideal, the refusal to allow yourselves to be ground down by mediocrity, the courage to commit yourselves humbly and patiently to improving yourselves and society, making the world more human and more fraternal."

We have kept these words close in mind over the last 12 years of youth ministry at Prince of Peace. The modern world presents so many seemingly appealing, definitely easier alternatives to Christianity that target young people who are drawn to what is going to make them feel happy and fulfilled. At POP, there are various programs offered to the young people in our parish. They cover all layers of raising kids up in the faith and forming the entire person. CYO (Catholic Youth Organization) meets every Sunday evening during the school year from 6:30p-8:30p in the Parish House; we enjoy a meal together, play together, and dive deeply into our faith together. We have always felt strongly that a large part of maintaining and cultivating the innocence of young people as they navigate their challenging high school years is to keep them playing and laughing while also giving them the opportunity to have important conversations in which they share their lives with one another around a table. It is always our goal to challenge them to enter into the deepest corners of their faith and learn to apply what they believe to their day to day lives, but at CYO we want to build a community of like minded young people who encourage one another in their shared Catholicism. Too much time is wasted in front of a screen, fishing for likes and followers; we emphasize the importance of play and face to face connection with people who understand striving to live in the world but not of it.

We hope to continue to work alongside and in conjunction with all of the programming designed at POP for young people. We've seen the transformative power of the Lord in the lives of young people who open themselves up to His grace and love. We can also assure you that the future of the Church is in incredible hands with the youth at our parish who are absolutely on fire for the Lord and are finding all the ways to defy mediocrity. It has been and continues to be an immense privilege to support parents in raising faithful Catholics, and to be a small part of the lives of your children. Thank you for trusting us and sharing your amazing children with us!
