Dear Parishioners,

Fraternus is a men's group that focuses on mentoring young men in grades 6th through 12th in the virtues taught in the Catholic faith. What makes Fraternus uniquely different from other youth programs is its multi-generational approach. Men of all ages are welcome to join as there are many roles needed to be filled to make this mission successful. Fraternus is the bridge between typical Catholic youth programs and men's Bible studies often found in Catholic churches.

Fraternus is more than a program for boys. Fraternus is firstly a brotherhood of men - we simply provide a way for the boys and young men to join us in that brotherliness. The men of Fraternus do not make cheap our example by merely talking to boys about brotherhood and virtue. We live it out right in front of them. As the saying goes, we cannot give what we do not have, and if we expect the next generation of men to be authentically Catholic, brotherly, and virtuous, we must live that *now* within our own ranks.

Fidelis is the sister program to Fraternus. We invite girls in grades 6-12 to a true sisterhood with women, young and old, leading each other to Christ. Our mission statement is to form girls- heart, mind, body, and soul — into a sisterhood of mature, virtuous disciples of Christ through the witness of Catholic women. It is impossible to not recognize the demise of our culture in the past years, in particular to women. Our girls are bombarded with confusing, often immoral, images and messages about what femininity is, what beauty is, what freedom is. There are many ministries in our churches but none that offer young girls living examples of what a woman who is striving to authentically live out her faith looks like.

Fidelis invites women into a virtuous life through personal prayer, participation in the Sacraments, and meaningful involvement with their parish. As women grow in holiness, the Holy Spirit compels them to pass this on to the next generation. Fidelis forms young women not only by teaching about virtue but also by presenting living models of discipleship.

A typical Fraternus/Fidelis night uses movie clips, sports activities, and games to teach virtue, all in the context of mentorship and brotherhood/sisterhood. The programs draw boys and girls into the heart of the Church by connecting discussions on virtue to the Sunday Mass readings. These lessons come to life during weekly meetings, seasonal outings, and an annual Inspire/Ranch trip where chapters from around the country gather for a retreat consisting of a combination of faith and fun all with the goal of growing in virtue and then taking that experience out into the world.




