Guest Writers: St. Isidore Angel Sharing Garden

An Extraordinary Parish for Ordinary People

Dear Fellow Parishioners,

Here is a chance, a way to interact and participate in God's good creation. The St. Isidore Angel Garden began this past spring and has been a beautiful and practical opportunity for generosity, education, and work within our parish and on our parish grounds. The namesake, St. Isidore, was a farmer in Spain who worked for a landowner and whose work was his daily prayer. He and his wife were consistently generous, giving away what food they had to anyone in need, even when they had so little themselves!

Everything grown this season in our own church garden has been given to our branch of the St. Vincent DePaul food pantry. Thanks to donations and volunteers this spring, we were able to establish 12 raised beds and fill them with 20 varieties of herbs, flowers, and vegetables. The St. Vincent DePaul food pantry on our church campus is open to the Greenville area on Monday mornings. We have been picking the garden produce on Monday before they open and then walking it straight across the parking lot to the food pantry. One recipient stated how excited they were to receive fresh produce for their family when basic food has become a luxury.





And what about the volunteers who have made the garden possible? When you work in a garden together there are opportunities that naturally arise. I have overheard conversations about seed preservation, discussions on the ups and downs of life, and a child's exclamation at discovering a squash beneath an enormous squash leaf. There is something about being outside and working side by side that gives the Holy Spirit an opportunity to work within and through us. Or at least to distract us from our woes with an exotically colored butterfly or the striking petals of a flower.

The plans for the garden development are not small. There are dreams and drawings for adding fruit trees, formal flower beds, benches, a shed and compost area, and an outdoor gathering space. We hope to create a space of sharing and education as well as a quiet and peaceful place for prayer and meditation. This fall, we will stay small and be focusing on growing a winter produce crop from seeds and establishing a definite water system to support the future plans. There is discussion of including simple recipe cards with our pro-

duce, to further assist recipients. If you want to volunteer in some way or in some capacity even if only for a few hours one day or to donate seedlings, it would be wonderful to see you out there.

This garden is open to and for everyone at Prince of Peace. It is meant to be an extension of the already beautiful church and church grounds. The hope is that one day you will be able to walk through this garden when you need a minute in prayer. The hope is that classes on plant growth will be taught to children and classes on canning, cooking and composting will be taught to everyone. The hope is that the garden will exist as a scene that reminds anyone who encounters or works in it that God is good and we are each a part of His good creation.






