### Letter from our Pastor

### An Extraordinary Parish for Ordinary People

Dear Parishioners,

As you know, Bishop Guglielmone gave me six weeks to go to explore something and somewhere that God has laid a burden on my heart for, in a place where I never in a million years would ever have thought would have even called my attention. We often have this idea of missionaries being heroic people doing extraordinary things in exotic places, sacrificing themselves nobly for the cause of the Gospel. And that is certainly the case for many. As for me, I don't think I contributed much at all to the life of the Church in what has been called the heart of the world. At Prince of Peace, I am very comfortable in my own skin and have reigned gloriously as Lord Pastor for over a decade, and I love every minute of it. In Istanbul, I had to experience the pain of desperately wanting to communicate and only being able to do so like a baby learning its first words. It was uncomfortable in all kinds of ways. I didn't give much at all, as I realized that I didn't really have all that much to give. But I received so very much, and maybe that was the point. God wanted to give a new nation to Abraham; He wanted to take Paul's stony legalistic heart and set it ablaze with the fire of the Spirit. He wanted to take Peter's rough and tumble enthusiasm and refine it into wise servant leadership. He wanted to take Newman's quiet bookish mental exercises and make them serve the purpose of attracting others to the communion of the Ancient Church. It wasn't about what they were going to do for Him. It was about what He was going to do in them.

The Church by her very nature is outward looking; it is itself a mission. But as universal as that mission of the Church is, we experience it as local. The Church Universal is made present in a concrete way in a local diocese, our neighborhood parish, with a very specific set of people who are all working their salvation out with the blessings, problems and challenges that they have. But we can also try to tame the Spirit and lock ourselves up in little silos where we become so inward looking that the heart of darkness overtakes hearts that were meant to be free. That's why the Church has always encouraged her pastors and her people to look beyond the local Church to other places. Foreign missions have to be as much of a reality for the domestic church just as much as the mission we have right here at Prince of Peace.

Today, Turkey is a secular state with an overwhelming Muslim majority. What we call Turkey today is the same territory where St Paul was from and went on his first missionary journeys. If we call Holy the Land where Jesus preached and taught, lived, died and rose again; Turkey is the Holy Land of the Church. It was there that the followers of Jesus were first called Christians; it is the site of the seven churches of the Book of Revelation, as well as the site of the first seven ecumenical councils of the Church. Up until World War I, 25% of the country was Christian. Only a century later, it is less than .5% Christian. But Turkey is also the only place in the Islamic world where it is not illegal to convert to Christianity. And there are indeed converts, and more who want to become Christians. There are also numerous immigrants who work in Turkey who are Latin Rite Catholics. Their life is not like any other place in the world. And while there is a lot of support, and thank God, for the beleaguered Christian presence in the Holy Land, there is practically nothing for the Church in the place where the first generation of Christians actually spread the Gospel.

This year, our spiritual focus as a parish is going to be on the conversion of our parish life from being inwardly directed at our own community to a broader vision of mission and evangelization, both here in our own backyard, as well as abroad. We now have a visible, tangible link that Providence is giving us. Prince of Peace has always been a place where sound doctrine and excellent liturgy have been driving forces. We now have a chance to bring back the very local church where that doctrine and liturgy had its sources, besides that of Our Lord in Jerusalem. We couldn't do what we do and be what we are without what happened in Nicea 1700 years ago. And now we are being called to replant the Church there. And it won't take a lot to do. So, let's roll up our sleeves and do it together.




