Letter from our Pastor

An Extraordinary Parish for Ordinary People

Dear Parishioners,

Nine in ten humans on this earth have only known Elizabeth II as the Queen of England. The British Empire, the only dominion in human history upon which the sun never set, saw a young girl mount the throne of St Edward and reign for over seventy years as the longest serving monarch in human history. This incredible woman saw some of the world's greatest countries gain independence and start their journey apart from the crown, and ruled at the time of her death over I4 countries and presided over a commonwealth of 54 independent countries. The British Royal Family has always held a great fascination for many people whose feet have never entered an imperial palace, and Elizabeth herself was seen as a tremendous example of governance and bringing the institution of monarchy into the modern world.

As an American of English heritage, I have always had a sincere affection for Lillibet, as she was fondly known by those who loved her. Her sense of dignity, decorum and grace was such an incredible model of virtue and diplomacy that even the most anti-monarchist political pundit could recognize in her something truly extraordinary. It feels like the passing of an era, one of those liminal moments in which there will always be a before and an after. On my many visits to the United Kingdom over the years I always enjoyed singing God Save the Queen and have added the collect for the Queen from the Book of Common Prayer to my own private devotion since I was a teenager.

Even though the vicissitudes of history made her by virtue of her office the Supreme Head of the Church of England, I was always impressed by her simple and childlike faith. She once said, "Each day is a new beginning, I know that the only way to live my life is to try to do what is right, to take the long view, to give of my best in all that the day brings, and to put my trust in God. I know just how much I rely on my own faith to guide me through the good times and the bad." Her special friendship with the evangelist Billy Graham brought her close to the orbit of the Christian faith of the South. And I was always edified by how her Christmas messages so often were better examples of love for the Prince of Peace then the most erudite rhetoric of our own hierarchy!

We will pray a Solemn High Latin Mass of Requiem for the Queen of England on 23 September at 7p, to pray for the soul of this committed and serious Christian who knew of her need for the mercy of the Lord. Charles III is now the King of England. Our own diocese has as its See City Charleston, which was named for his namesake, King Charles II, whose deathbed conversion to Catholicism paved the way for tolerance of Catholics after the horrors of the English so -called Reformation. Under his successor Elizabeth's reign, Catholicism, which had been a despised minority religion for centuries, has emerged with more practitioners than the Established Church of which Elizabeth was the sovereign head. Let us pray that Mary's Dowry may continue to recover her Catholic heritage, and for all of those whose heritage is English that they may have the same simple faith and discharge the duties of their state in life with simplicity and joy.






