Letter from our Pastor

Dear Parishioners,

An Extraordinary Parish for Ordinary People

Experts aren't always right. In fact, we are seeing a crisis of confidence in experts in all kinds of fields. Experts may be knowledgeable in one field but then draw conclusions in another field; or they miss how their contribution is part of a larger one; or they forget they can be manipulated or misunderstood, especially in the current toxic political climate. At the same time though, it is understandable why medical doctors get very tired of patients who self-diagnose and then refuse to take into consideration what those who have actually been to medical school think about their symptoms and underlying causes. The professional expert is sidelined by the amateur hack who thinks he knows better because "he has done the research," namely, with Dr Google.

There is an entire emerging class of talking heads in the Church today of laypeople who comment on theological matters. What is interesting about this, is that the most influential of them actually don't have much formal theological training at all, and Catholic laypeople are often investing a lot of trust in them while ignoring those who by their ordination have the *munus* of teaching, governing and sanctifying in the Church, or have been given what is called a *mandatum* by the Holy See to teach theology.

A trained theologian knows there is a distinction between *dogma*, defined teaching on faith and morals, and *theology*, which seeks to understand that dogma. We now live in an age in which people who are not properly formed in the theological disciplines think that mere proof texting scripture quotes, catechism paragraphs, or citations from saints and theologians of the past is sufficient to answer all questions. What is even more disturbing is that, with no authority given to them at all, they write reams and reams of cyberink seeking to burden the consciences of other people with what are actually theological opinions presented as if they are divinely revealed propositions of faith. Unfortunately, many priests today do not have a deep theological formation either, and when they do not draw proper distinctions, they can seriously confuse the faithful. The faithful then get confused, draw themselves into opposing camps, fight with each other, create serious divisions within the Body of Christ, and lose faith in the authority of God in His Church!

You shouldn't have to have a doctorate in moral theology to go to heaven. The Pharisees took 10 commandments and made them into 613, doing theology but then arrogating their own speculation into morally binding weight. Jesus was able to explain the original 10 as 2: Love the Lord your God with all your heart, and all your mind and all your strength, and your neighbor as yourself. The Gospel is meant to free us to love, not to burden us with soul-crushing man-made restrictions. Sometimes I have people come into the confessional with agonizing crises of conscience and anxiety attacks convinced they are going to hell because they have confused the ongoing development of theological speculation by people who have neither the authority to teach in the name of the Church nor a real theological formation with what is binding on them as Catholic Christians. They are often surprised when I say, "You are free in this matter, and you have the right to resolve any doubt in your favor." Some people really just want to be told what to do in every conceivable moment of their lives rather than undertake the process of forming their conscience by developing the virtues and the interior life of prayer to live the freedom of the children of God. And so they keep going from one priest to the next, from one internet personality to the next, and get more and more confused and hopeless as they receive more and more information they don't know how to process. It's like the people who think they need an exorcism, but aren't willing to go to confession, pray and go to Mass. "Naaaaah, that can't be it..."

Saint Augustine was one of the most prolific writers and deep theological thinkers in history. And what was his advice? Ama et fac quod vis – Love and do what you will. It's not about meriting heaven by following 613 man-made rules. It's about true, authentic love guiding our freedom to do what is good!

The Church offers a Plenary Indulgence to the faithful who attend each evening of a parish mission, there will be a special Apostolic Blessing on the last evening at the Mass to impart the Indulgence.

Father Joseph will, if able, bring first class relics of Blessed Solanus Casey and Saint Padre Pio for veneration by the faithful.

The mission will be led by Capuchin Franciscan Friar, Fr Joseph Tuscan, OFM Cap.

Fr. Joseph was born in Columbus, OH, in 1967 and was raised in Canton, OH. He earned his Bachelor's degree in 1989 from Borromeo College Seminary. In 1990, he professed his first vows as a Capuchin Franciscan friar. Making his Perpetual vows in 1993, he went on to earn his Master's degree in theology in 1995 and was ordained to the priesthood in 1997. Fr. Joseph's first assignment after ordination was in Papua New Guinea in the South Pacific where he served for four years. Returning to the US in 2001, he has served in various capacities as parochial vicar, pastor, military and hospital chaplain and has also served in Puerto Rico.

Fr. Joseph currently serves as the national director of the Archconfraternity of Christian Mothers and in fulltime preaching ministry for the Capuchin Province of St. Augustine, offering retreats and reflection days for parishes, Religious and Priests.
