Letter from our Pastor

An Extraordinary Parish for Ordinary People

Dear fellow Parishioners,

This past summer, in June, I had the privilege of becoming a Knight of Merit of the Sacred Military Constantinian Order of St. George, culminating with my investiture in Philadelphia just last month. The membership in the order has been historically reserved for nobility, with knights committing themselves to the propagation and defense of the Catholic, Apostolic, Roman Faith, and the assistance to the poor. In the past, the Order has been instrumental in the fight against Mediterranean piracy, ransoming Christian slaves, and assisting the poor who often escaped from the Ottoman-controlled lands into the Neapolitan Kingdom.

Traditionally claiming to have been founded by the saintly emperor Constantine himself and perpetuated by the Byzantine emperors, the Order has first emerged into documented existence in Italy with the arrival from Albania a nobleman Andres Engjëlli (Andrea Angeli, died 1580) who, as a member of the Angelo Flavio Comneno family, traced his descent from the Byzantine Emperor Isaac II Angelos (late 12th c. – early 13th c.), and thus supposedly from St. Constantine. His Grand Magistry of the Order was officially recognized by Pope Paul III Farnese in 1545.

While some critics doubt the veracity of the Order's founding in Late Antiquity and the very claims of the Angeli to the princely status and its descent from the imperial Angeloi dynasty, the reality on the ground in the Balkans and Greece in early modern period, under the Ottoman rule, was rather complex. Many of the old Albanian, Serbian, Greek families – Engjëlli, Kastrioti Skanderbeg, Anđelović, Philanthropenos etc. – indeed stressed their real or perceived ties to the ancient Roman and Byzantine past – these claims acted both as legitimization of their own leadership positions and reassertion of the Christian identity that was under continuous assault by the Ottomans.

In the 1620s, the Constantinian Order came under the headship of the Farnese family (so instrumental in its initial recognition in the Latin West), becoming in effect a dynastic order (unlike those of the Order of Malta or the Holy Sepulchre). In 1731, with the death of the last male Farnese, the headship of the Order came into uninterrupted possession of the Spanish branch of Bourbon dynasty, the cadet line that had ruled the Italian South as Kings of Naples and Sicily (Kingdom of Two Sicilies) prior to the creation of unified Italy in the second half of 19th c. While there have been dynastic schisms in headship of the order (some competing branches still exist), the current legitimate Grand Master of the Order is Prince Pedro of Bourbon-Two Sicilies, Duke of Calabria, Grandee of Spain, the oldest great-great-great-nephew to the last King of Two Sicilies, the Servant of God, Francis II (1831-1894), whose beatification process is under way.

I have spent a great deal of time in Italy, in Rome, Naples, and Venice – many of my friends there were knights of the Order and its chaplains – many with ties to the Santissima Trinità dei Pellegrini, the Roman mother-parish to our dear Pastor, Fr. Smith, and myself. Both in Rome and Naples, I loved the camaraderie of likeminded individuals devoted to the Church and mindful of the great wealth of the Italian traditions and history. My own scholarship on the architecture and art for the non-Latin immigrant communities in Italy, my Eastern European origins in the lands with ties to Byzantium, and my emigration from East to West, all literally and/or metaphorically made my entering the Constantinian Order quite providential. It also reminded me of some tangible links of the Carolinas to the Mezzogiorno – Italian South – something that would require a deeper examination.



Returning to the US in 2001, he has served in various capacities as parochial vicar, pastor, military and hospital chaplain and has also served in Puerto Rico.

Fr. Joseph currently serves as the national director of the Archconfraternity of Christian Mothers and in fulltime preaching ministry for the Capuchin Province of St. Augustine, offering retreats and reflection days for parishes, Religious and Priests.
