Letter from our Pastor

An Extraordinary Parish for Ordinary People

Dear Parishioners,

There is a fine balance in pastoral life between efficiency and trying to meet the needs of people. When I was a younger priest, I balked at the idea of making people call the parish office to set an appointment with me, because I never made an appointment to speak with my father, so why would I make my spiritual children do that with me? But I quickly found out that making people wait and then not get to see me because I had something that was scheduled didn't work, and I soon found that I was not living a balanced life by being always available for appointments.

For the past twelve years at Prince of Peace, we have done our utmost to accommodate people's wishes as far as scheduling funerals, baptisms and weddings. You may not be aware of it, but triangulating schedules between clergy, musicians, facilities, family members, cleaners, maintenance people, vendors, volunteers for receptions, cemeteries and the list goes on, is incredibly complex. For the most part, in the past we have been able to make this work with only the very rare conflict. The sheer volume of funerals, baptisms and weddings now has made what used to mean just a little extra coordination into a bit of a nightmare. Add to that the regularly scheduled liturgical services as well as other events in the church and it has become highly complex indeed. People often come because they want to do something in the church and go away sad when we have to tell them that the church is booked for months and months in advance. Even Mass intentions have become so popular, that we don't have enough Masses in the schedule to cover them. A priest also can't just multiply Masses ad infinitum. The discipline of the Church wisely limits him in this regard to one Mass a day, with bination tolerated, and trination is allowed in this diocese by a special permission of the Apostolic See. Father Tomlinson and I have both found that we are trinating for some reason or another on a regular basis, even during the week, and even on what are supposed to be days off. And that doesn't count requests for Mass and confessions off campus.

Please remember that, while a priest is encouraged to celebrate Mass every day, there is no expectation that a public Mass has to be celebrated in the church every day, much less twice a day. Now, at Prince of Peace, we have a particularly serious commitment to the sacred liturgy and the Holy Sacrament of the Altar, which is why we try to provide as many opportunities for our people to assist at Holy Mass as possible, and why the Adoration Chapel is the secret engine room of the parish. But multiplying things just to multiply them is not the mind of the Church. Mass is the most important thing we do every day, but it is not the only thing we do every day.

Also, even with two full time priests at the hospitals, the sheer volume of requests for anointing of the sick has increased significantly. While some of these anointings are of parishioners after Mass on the day before they go into surgery, that is not the case at all with the vast majority of them, which take place in hospitals, nursing homes, hospice facilities and private homes. We do our best to take care of those physically close to the parish, and then those who call Prince of Peace their spiritual home wherever they may be located, but we often get calls from people who are unassigned to a parish, or they get Prince of Peace first when calls to other parishes go unanswered. You might be surprised to hear this, but I am not at all bothered at getting calls in the middle of the night. The hard part is when they happen in the middle of the day, when Fr Tomlinson and I are caught between a schedule which is becoming less flexible because of already scheduled events at the parish.

Something has to give. There are more people, more demands, and more needs. But there are not more priests. And our priests have to focus their energies on what they alone can do, and program enough flexibility in their schedules to be able to attend to emergencies in a timely manner between them, as well what needs to happen in the parish.

Fr. Joseph currently serves as the national director of the Archconfraternity of Christian Mothers and in fulltime preaching ministry for the Capuchin Province of St. Augustine, offering retreats and reflection days for parishes, Religious and Priests.
