Letter from our Pastor

An Extraordinary Parish for Ordinary People

Dear Parishioners,

As a kid growing up in Greenville, fall was my favorite season. I loved that little crisp feel in the air as the interminable summer heat gave way to something more bearable. My family was a big football family, so that meant high school football (Carolina or Southside) on Friday, Clemson on Saturday and the Miami Dolphins or the Dallas Cowboys on Sunday, with the occasional impromptu throwing around of the old pigskin around the yard. Halloween and Thanksgiving were the main events of the season. Thanksgiving in my house was always the source of some of the more hilarious events that have passed into family lore, starting with the Macy's parade while the smells of pecan pie filled the house and ending with everyone on the couch in a tryptophan coma.

I still have these hysterical pictures of me with my plastic little orange Jack O'Lantern and some plastic mask and costume getting ready for trick or treating around the neighborhood. The children of the 80s will know exactly which costumes I'm talking about: the ones that would probably get denounced now as unsafe. Why I had a string of Looney Tunes characters for years in a row, I can't remember. I do remember that the adults in my life had lots of discussions over whether Bible-believing Christians should be celebrating some pagan holiday like Hallow-een. Interestingly enough, my family observed many of the classic prohibitions of fundamentalist Christianity, like no alcohol and no card playing or gambling. But my mother always drew the line at Halloween, because she had to have Polaroids of my supposed cuteness and she was convinced that Halloween and dancing were good things, no matter what our church had to say about the matter. Of course, this was the lady who blasted the *Dirty Dancing* soundtrack singing along to it with on a cassette tape until I replaced it with a cassette tape of Jean-Baptiste Lully's *Te Deum* borrowed over and over again from the library. Maybe that explains some things about me...

When I discovered Catholicism, I was excited to hear about All Saints' Day and to realize that Halloween was actually a vigil of a Catholic feast. Even today I love to see our little kiddos dress up like saints and martyrs rather than goons and goblins. I mean, who wants to see a glow in the dark skeleton when you can see a kindergartener dressed like St Lucy, with her eyeballs on a platter as a sign of her martyrdom? My very puritanical forebears are spinning in their graves...

This year we invite all of our families over to the church at 6.15p on All Saints' Day, I November. At 6.30p, we are going to have a little devotional procession of the saints around our church. We invite you to stay for Mass at 7p, since it is a holy day, unless you've already gone to Mass that day. We are asking all of the children to dress up like their favorite saint, and they can carry an image of the saint or a relic if you got one. The kids will gather in the narthex, with their parents or other loved ones who will flank each kid with lighted candles, and then we're going to march around the church singing the Litany of the Saints. Don't overthink it; it's all for good Catholic fun.


