Letter from our Pastor

An Extraordinary Parish for Ordinary People

Dear Parishioners,

Very often when I give a penance in the confessional, I will ask people to pray for the souls in purgatory. Devotion to the Holy Souls is one of those babies that got thrown out with the bathwater after Vatican II. There were some rather strange pious practices and even superstitious beliefs that grew up around the doctrine of purgatory, which clouded its essential nature, and many of those have mercifully faded away, especially in this country. There were those, however, who for some reason got it into their heads that somehow Vatican II abolished purgatory. The only time I have ever literally stopped Mass was when a deacon was preaching and said, "Some of you remember when we still believed in purgatory before Vatican II abolished it," to which I responded, "Not even an ecumenical council can abolish spiritual realities, so we are going to pray for the dead at this Mass today." Awkward.

The souls in purgatory can't do anything for themselves. Their ultimate fate is sealed because their souls and bodies are separated, and hence they can't exercise their will to perform any action. The Church reminds us that our prayers assist them in that state of purification. It is one of the many ways we not only remember the dead, but actually bear their burdens by prayer and sacrificing for them.

But can the souls in purgatory do anything for others? That is a controverted theological question that the Church has not settled yet. There are some who say no. I tend to think that they can. I mean, what else are they going to do in purgatory but pray? And if they are in the state of purification, would they not want to grow in love as the God of Love unites them to Himself, and love by its nature diffuses itself?

I also think that the souls in purgatory are going to know if we prayed for them, and, when their purification is complete, they are going to remember that we prayed for them and in their gratitude, as they become saints in heaven, they are going to be powerful intercessors for us in heaven. It is literally the best way of paying it forward I can imagine.

There was an interview with a mystic named Maria Simms called *Get us Out of Here* that was published in English twenty years ago. Deacon Bob Smith introduced me to this book when I came to Prince of Peace, and credits it with jumpstarting much of his devotion to the Holy Souls. I'm not sure the book even has an imprimatur or nihil obstat of approval, because of the nature of its genre. And it's not really my cup of tea as a book, but it did certainly give me a lot of food for thought on why devotion to the Holy Souls is so important and profitable.

It's natural for Catholics to pray for their loved ones who have passed. But what about our enemies who have died? What about the most forgotten soul in purgatory, those who have no one to pray for them, those who are at the fulfillment of their purification, and those who have just entered upon it? What about the souls of priests who have inspired and taught us, and for the souls of priests who were Judases rather than Jesus?

This November, let's not forget to pray for the faithful departed.

Joseph's first assignment after ordination was in Papua New Guinea in the South Pacific where he served for four years. Returning to the US in 2001, he has served in various capacities as parochial vicar, pastor, military and hospital chaplain and has also served in Puerto Rico.

Fr. Joseph currently serves as the national director of the Archconfraternity of Christian Mothers and in fulltime preaching ministry for the Capuchin Province of St. Augustine, offering retreats and reflection days for parishes, Religious and Priests.




