Letter from our Pastor

An Extraordinary Parish for Ordinary People

Dear Parishioners,

The Catholic Church takes marriage very seriously. It is one of the seven sacraments instituted by Christ to produce the grace that it signifies, namely the union of one man and one woman for life as a sign of the irrevocable love of God. The Church takes off her shoes like Moses before the burning bush that is on fire but does not consume, holy ground, before marriage. It is the only sacrament where the recipient is also the minister: the couple themselves "make valid" the sacrament. The Church's witness then says, *What God has joined together, let no one put asunder*. The Church has rightly always had a horror of adultery and divorce as grave evils that pull families apart and destroy interior peace.

At the same time though, the brokenness of human nature is seen in family life when husbands and wives are ripped apart from each other. There are not infrequently very real human dramas of suffering, abuse and emotional manipulation that are heart breaking for everyone involved. Sometimes couples choose to end the civil effects of their marriage by resorting to civil courts to dissolve it by divorce. At times, people who have gone through this trauma don't even want to think about getting into a new relationship with anyone. They often will spend a lot of time working through their grief and making themselves stronger and better individuals forged in a crucible to emerge from such crises with hope and renewed trust in love. Some seek an annulment from the Church, that recognition that, as far as human weakness can know, there was something present from the very beginning which made the words, *I do*, not efficacious. Such persons then can take ownership of that freedom as their conscience directs. Then there are those who enter into a relationship without the benefit of annulment and the Church's blessing on a new marriage; or they come to it later.

Each situation is unique, and emotions understandably drive a lot of decisions made in such long and agonizing processed. But no matter what decisions are made, people who have been divorced are still children of God, are still Catholics by their baptism, and are still called to a life of holiness within the community of faith. But they do not always experience their parishes as places where their wounds can be healed and their brokenness tended to. They often experience isolation, judgmentalism and even abusive behavior in the Church instead of understanding, compassion and that love which truly heals. We forget that it is up to God to discern the intentions and acts of each one of us at the Last Judgment; until our death, we are always works in progress. It is the task of the Church to preach the truth, and to accompany believers on their journey, even when they have moments of disconnect, rebellion and bewilderment.

As a parish, I think we do a great job about preaching the Good News about marriage, sex and family life. But do we do a great job about supporting couples and families in crisis? Are we there to help pick up the pieces or do we stand off like the pharisee rolling his eyes at the publican? Or do we just feel like we should do something but we're too timid or unsure ourselves what to do? Sometimes our families just need to know that, yes, Jesus still loves them, that the Church still wants them, and that faith will always win. My dear friends in the parish, if are divorced and haven't found that love, please accept my apologies as your pastor, and help us try to do better, even as we fearlessly proclaim the truth of the Gospel.



Fr. Joseph's first assignment after ordination was in Papua New Guinea in the South Pacific where he served for four years. Returning to the US in 2001, he has served in various capacities as parochial vicar, pastor, military and hospital chaplain and has also served in Puerto Rico.

Fr. Joseph currently serves as the national director of the Archconfraternity of Christian Mothers and in fulltime preaching ministry for the Capuchin Province of St. Augustine, offering retreats and reflection days for parishes, Religious and Priests.



Dear Friends in Christ,

When my father was diagnosed with Parkinson's and dementia, I knew that I was entering into a very different phase of life, without any sense of how long that phase might be or what kind of person I would be on the other side of it. So when our beloved principal, Steve Cunningham, came to me confide that he and Jess were about to enter upon a similar phase of their life with their families, I immediately understood. Our Catholic religion teaches us about the sanctity of life, the importance of family, and the value of sacrifice. The news of the Cunninghams' departure at the end of this academic year is incredibly sad for me personally and as pastor of Prince of Peace. But the very fact that after prayer and discernment, they are moving home to honor their parents in a stage of life in which they are needed: that speaks volumes as to the integrity of their faith and their belief in the very values that make our Catholic schools so special.

Steve has done an incredible job in a relatively short period of time. He stepped into a school in transition and brought teaching experience, administrative acumen and a joyful but calm demeanor that was all a gift of God. He also took us from some very lean years to a new era of abundance while keeping us fit for mission, a gift that is rare and precious in school principals. But like all gifts from God, they are to be used according to His will and in His timing. It is a reminder that, as much as we don't like change, only the Cross of Christ stays the same. The challenge of filling Steve's shoes as the principal of our school is formidable; there's no doubt about that. But with thanksgiving for the gift that the Cunninghams are to us, we also see an opportunity to continue to move forward in faith. The Lord who blessed us with just the right man at the right time has His eye on the families that call Prince of Peace their spiritual home, and He will guide the process to choose a new principal.

I have asked Steve to personally guide the Principal Search Committee. It unusual for a pastor to ask an outgoing principal to guide the search for his successor, but I think it is extremely appropriate. We will be advertising the position in a national search through early January, and the committee will make a recommendation of three names to interview and vet, and then I will make the final decision. I ask for your prayers through this process that we make the best decision. I know that transitions of this sort are hard on families, but the day in and day out dedication of our faculty and staff means that the foundation of the school is very solid and healthy, and we will keep moving from strength to strength. For now, let us prayerfully engage this process and celebrate Steve's many accomplishments while driving forward to future glory!
