Letter from our Pastor

An Extraordinary Parish for Ordinary People

Dear Parishioners,

Your favorite Advent Grinch here checking in to afflict the early Christmas revelers. Advent is a short, but particularly rich liturgical season whose spiritual impact so often gets swallowed up or eclipsed by this totally fabricated holiday season that trades in the sobriety of Advent for consumerist excess that exhausts everyone so that the actual Christmas season, which starts on 25 December, is experienced as totally anticlimactic. The novena, feast and octave of the Immaculate Conception; the Greater Ferias of Advent with the O Antiphons; the Rorate Masses on Saturdays; the Christmas Novena and Octave; the Epiphany and feasts of the Christmas season that lasts until 2 February. All of that spiritually nourishing richness has to compete with office Christmas parties, trying to figure out gifts for people you don't even like, and being assaulted with eggnog and cookies during what is – yes, I am going to say it - a penitential season.

If it were up to me, everyone would come to church early on 24 December after the traditional morning vigil Mass and help decorate the church in lighting speed and then go home and help get their domestic churches ready for the coming of the Christ Child. The first Mass, as per Catholic tradition, would be Midnight Mass, and everyone who couldn't come to that would come at dawn on Christmas Day for the Aurora Mass (which we never get to do) or the Day Mass. Family making and merriment until Solemn Vespers and Benediction in the evening with the whole church, and a quiet night of joyful rest to prepare for 40 Days of Christmas Merriment.

That is the tradition of our forefathers in Catholic culture and is a much healthier way to do all of this. But, like the lone voice crying out in the wilderness, I pine for better days that I hope to see at some point before I shove off this mortal coil to be with the Prince of Peace forever. Unfortunately, I can't even try to privately observe Advent and Christmas in this fashion. I am absolutely a tiny minority voice even in a parish like Prince of Peace, which goes to show that anyone who thinks Catholic priests wield tremendous influence and power are eating too many candy canes or something! We try to keep Advent as Advent, but the herculean task of decorating our large church with amazing volunteers means that, as the season goes on, Christmas kind of gradually strongarms its way into our spaces and hearts. Maybe that gradual Christmasicization (is that even a word) is not a bad thing. And Christmas: well, everyone seems like they want to get their religion over with as early as possible on Christmas Eve and get on with everything else, and then the beauty of the 40 Days of Christmas just seems like Catholics deliberately holding onto the magic of Christmas after everyone else has thrown out their trees on Boxing Day.

Sorry for the curmudgeonly rant. Kind of. You kind people have christened me the Advent Grinch, and an Advent Grinch gotta do what an Advent Grinch gotta do. Those of you who are new to Prince of Peace might be a bit shocked by the amount of good natured ribbing and teasing that goes around our parish this time of year as the pastor frowns with loud *harrumphs* and his people frolick before him with holiday abandon. But it is also part of what makes this such a fun parish as well. And if that isn't part of the joy for this season, I don't know what else is! Happy Adventing... in a restrained and penitential, joyful and expecting kinda way!

Making his Perpetual vows in 1993, he went on to earn his Master's degree in theology in 1995 and was ordained to the priesthood in 1997.

Fr. Joseph's first assignment after ordination was in Papua New Guinea in the South Pacific where he served for four years. Returning to the US in 2001, he has served in various capacities as parochial vicar, pastor, military and hospital chaplain and has also served in Puerto Rico.

Fr. Joseph currently serves as the national director of the Archconfraternity of Christian Mothers and in fulltime preaching ministry for the Capuchin Province of St. Augustine, offering retreats and reflection days for parishes, Religious and Priests.
