Letter from our Pastor

An Extraordinary Parish for Ordinary People

Dear Parishioners,

The only musical instrument mentioned by name, other than the human voice which is the perfect instrument, is the pipe organ. The Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy of Vatican II, Sacrosanctum Concilium, in article 120, states:

The pipe organ is to be held in high esteem in the Latin Church, since it is its traditional instrument, the sound of which can add a wonderful splendor to the Church's ceremonies and powerfully lift up men's minds to God and higher things. The use of other instruments may also be admitted in divine worship, given the decision and consent of the competent territorial authority, provided that the instruments are suitable for sacred use, or can be adapted to it, that they are in keeping with the dignity of the temple, and truly contribute to the edification of the faithful.

This paragraph was cited again in *Musicam sacram* from 1967, the document which governs music the Church. At a press conference after that document was issued, Annibale Bugnini, the architect of the liturgical reform, who was not known for being a guardian of tradition, was asked, "What instruments are not suitable for sacred music?" He seemed perplexed at such a question, and answered, "Well, you know, guitars and things like that." It was completely unthinkable to the man responsible for much of the destruction of traditional worship in the last century that "pickin and a grinnin', hummin and a strummin'" common to the emerging phenomenon of *Folk Mass*es could find its way into Mass.

But why? Well, two reasons. The first reason is that the organ by its nature can sustain congregational singing. When you press the key of an organ, the sound lasts as long as you push the note, so no matter how long the note you sing, it can accompany a singer for the duration of the note. A guitar or a piano, for example, can't accompany sound in that way because the instrument isn't meant to accompany, but to complement sound. The second reason is that the liturgy tends to shun music that has secular associations. Now, in the history of the liturgy there have been numerous times in which sacred and secular music have been a little too close: medieval madrigals, orchestral operas and jazz and blues all in their turn have been seen in the Mass. And those moments have often been accompanied by purist reactions. At one point, St Pius X was so annoyed by warbly sopranos eeking out arias at Mass that he banned women from the choir loft and definitely ended the practice of using castrated men to produce that same sound in the papal chapel. His prohibition against women in the loft was overturned quietly by Pius XII after having been ignored everywhere, but thank God the age of the *castrati* is over. If you don't believe me, just YouTube the famous recording of The Last Castrato and you will thank St Pius X.

At Prince of Peace, we treasure Gregorian chant and organ music, alongside English hymnody (which was the fruit of centuries of vernacular singing) and polyphonic Masses of various styles. But you may not realize that our organ is, well, not actually an organ. It's basically a computer with speakers with the outward form of an organ. And those things have a short shelf life. When the Bicentennial Campaign is over with, we have to address the need for a real pipe organ that can handle the unique repertoire we have at Prince of Peace, and be a concert worthy instrument to put Prince of Peace even more on the map of places for the best in sacred music.

Growing up, every Sunday at 1.30p I would put on NPR to listen to *Pipe Dreams*, a radio show that over the years introduced me to the wonderful world of the King of the Instruments and to the amazing musicians who bring that instrument to life. There is still a website where those weekly transmissions happen, but the cultural philistinism of our times means that now our local NPR has replaced that radio show with just more boring talk shows. Day of Prayer for Protection of Unborn Children

An Extraordinary Parish for Ordinary People

On 22 January 1973, the Supreme Court legalized abortion throughout the United States in its companion decisions Roe v. Wade and Doe v. Bolton. Since that time, millions of children have lost their lives, and millions of women and families have been wounded by abortion.

On 24 June 2022, the Dobbs v. Jackson Women's Health Organization decision overturned Roe v. Wade, and we praise God for the great opportunity state and federal legislators now have to protect pre-born children. While God, in His mercy, ended the nearly fifty-year nationwide regime of abortion on demand, right now state and federal laws, in many instances, are still hostile to pre-born children. In South Carolina, abortions are permissible in all three trimesters of pregnancy, under specified circumstances. A growing number of abortions, an estimated 70%, across the US are happening through medication (e.g. chemical abortion) in isolation in homes and dormitories. Great prayer and advocacy is very needed.

The General Instruction of the Roman Missal (GIRM), no. 373, designates January 22 as a particular day of prayer and penance, called the "Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of Unborn Children." In all the Dioceses of the United States of America, January 22 (or January 23, when January 22 falls on a Sunday) shall be observed as a particular day of prayer for the full restoration of the legal guarantee of the right to life and of penance for violations to the dignity of the human person committed through acts of abortion.

Here are some special ways your family can observe this day:

- **Pray and fast.** Consider standing in prayerful witness outside of the Greenville Women's Clinic. (1142 Grove Rd). Add local abortion providers to your prayers: Terry L. Buffkin, MD & T.W. Campbell Jr., MD.
- **Join POP for Life during January!** When a baby is born, every Birthright of Greenville mother is given a "Baby Bundle." As you can imagine, they go through these items fairly quickly and our support is needed! Here are the specific needed items to drop off at the school during their office hours:
 - Diapers Sizes Newborn, 1, 3, 4, 5
 - Baby wipes and towels
 - Baby wash/shampoo
 - Sleepers- 0-3, 3-6 month
 - Muslin wrap blankets
 - Bottles-small and large (new only)
 - Teethers/rattles/baby toys (new only)
 - Girls winter clothes- size 3-6 months
 - Boys winter clothes-0-3 and 3-6 months
 - Soft infant books or board books
- 82% of people impacted by abortion do not know where to go for healing according to ground-breaking research from Support After Abortion¹. Half of abortions each year are a 2nd, 3rd, 4th+ for a woman (Guttmacher). Without healing, the trauma of abortion is perpetuated.
