Letter from our Pastor

An Extraordinary Parish for Ordinary People

Dear Parishioners,

In late January, Rasmus Paludan, a Danish politician, staged a protest in front of the Turkish Embassy in Stockholm, Sweden. His group, the Hard Line Party, has been touring towns all over Northern Europe drumming up support for his views with a view to influencing elections. During this protest, Paludan set fire to a copy of the Qur'an, the Muslim sacred text they believe was revealed to the Prophet Muhammad by the Archangel Gabriel. Reactions varied from violent riots to passioned calls for peace and dialogue. The Turkish Directory for Religious Affairs responded in a very interesting way: it arranged for the Qur'an to be chanted, from start to finish, in every mosque of the country.

Now, of course, as a Christian, I do not believe the same things as Muslims do about the divine origin of this book, even as they hold the Torah and the Gospels in high regard. I thought of what it must be like for Muslims all over the world, and right here in home, to witness such a provocatory act against their faith. For Muslims, the Qur'an isn't just a text that you read and study; reciting and listening to it is a form of communion with God, and for them is analogous to receiving the Eucharist for us Catholics. The Turkish government could have added fuel to the fire by urging its people to respond in a violent way. But instead, they called their people to an act of worship.

It made me think about how Christian reactions to sacrilege and blasphemy are so weak and ineffectual. The Bible is burned by atheists and extremists of many other religions; the Blessed Sacrament is routinely ignored, maltreated, and abused even by those who claim to be Catholics. And how do we respond? While it is good to follow the Prince of Peace and not follow up those events with hatred and threatening perpetrators' lives, have we become complacent at how our faith is reviled in the public square? Can you imagine, in response to one Bible burning or desecration of the Blessed Sacrament, if every Catholic church in the nation read the entire Bible out loud, and had Adoration of the Most Blessed Sacrament and Masses of Reparation around the clock? What message would that send about how seriously we take our faith?

Whatever you may personally think about Islam, or of how the Muslim presence in the West should be seen, statistics show something overwhelming. Islam is the fastest growing religion on Earth, and its adherents are growing rapidly because they are having children. And the so-called Christian West seems to have very little to say in response to it. Political stunts of bravado that make headlines are not making any headway into restoring an authentically Christian culture. If we don't have children, if we don't even act like we care whether our faith is important to us and true or not, if we roll over and refuse to engage our critics with prayer, worship and devotion, we shouldn't be surprised when churches are converted into mosques, and when a way of life we thought was unassailable becomes very precarious indeed.

But what should be our attitude towards the sacred texts of other religions? Rigorists in every age want to make extremists of us all, proscribing and outright destroying anything and everything that they don't approve, and what they approve of always seems to be a smaller and smaller list. Christians who believe that the Bible is the revealed Word of God don't have to fear texts of other religions, even when we do not assign any salvific value to them. But seeds of truth can be found there too, and wisdom can be had even in texts that are not part of our tradition. While our way of approaching the Bible is going to be entirely different than the way we read other books, it is still not a bad idea to understand what motivates the religious path of others. We won't know how to proclaim Good News to them if we don't know what Good News has already been shared with them!

south carolina abortion facts

In South Carolina, abortion is presently legal up to 24 weeks post-conception. With the recent ruling by the state Supreme Court striking down a Fetal Heartbeat Law, South Carolina serves as a safe haven for abortionists. There are two avenues to solve this crisis:

- Gov. Henry McMaster has pledged his commitment to fighting this injustice in court. He has petitioned to re-appeal at the S.C. Supreme Court.
- The state General Assembly has re-filed its Human Life Protection Act, which significantly limits abortion post-conception and protects the lives of mothers.

The South Carolina Catholic Conference, a public policy voice for Catholics, supports these causes and is actively working this legislative session to pass the Human Life Protection Act.
