Letter from our Pastor



An Extraordinary Parish for Ordinary People

Dear Parishioners,

Forty is a significant number in the Bible. The Israelites wandered in the desert for forty years as they went from the slavery of Egypt to the Promised Land. Christ spent forty days in the wilderness before his public ministry. The forty days of Lent commemorate those events as we recall our own Exodus to freedom with the Resurrection. Tradition holds that the Body of the Lord lay in the tomb for forty hours. For that reason, during the Catholic Reformation, it became common to observe forty hours of Solemn Adoration of the Most Blessed Sacrament, particularly during the season of Lent, or as a way to prepare for that fasting time.

This devotion is often called by its Italian title, *Quarant'Ore*, since it first originated in Milan in 1537. St Philip Neri did much to popularize the devotion at his Confraternity of

Santissima Trinità dei Pellegrini, which today serves as the personal parish for the Extraordinary Form in Rome. St John Neumann brought it to the United States in 1844 when the anti-Catholic Know Nothing riots seized Philadelphia with violence. In many dioceses, parishes organized so that one after another, parishes alternated having forty hours of adoration so that it was always going on somewhere in the diocese. After Vatican II, the *Quarant'Ore* virtually disappeared. St John Paul II, however, put so much emphasis on adoration of the Blessed Sacrament, that chapels of Perpetual Adoration, which previously were quite rare indeed, sprung up everywhere, including at Prince of Peace.

The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops has asked for a Eucharistic Revival. Prince of Peace is already an intensely Eucharistic parish. So our Lenten mission lived as a *Quarant'Ore* of Adoration from 19-21 March will be a powerful opportunity, by bringing Adoration into the large church and inviting more people to participate in it, to be a part of that Eucharistic Revival. Fr Nicholas Edmonds Smith, a spiritual son of St Philip Neri as an Oratorian Father, and the superior of the Oxford Oratory, is coming to preach that mission during that intense time of prayer for us. Go ahead and mark your calendars to join us for as much as you can. Even if you are not a regular adorer, we ask that every family in the parish come for adoration during

south carolina abortion facts

In South Carolina, abortion is presently legal up to 24 weeks post-conception. With the recent ruling by the state Supreme Court striking down a Fetal Heartbeat Law, South Carolina serves as a safe haven for abortionists. There are two avenues to solve this crisis:

- Gov. Henry McMaster has pledged his commitment to fighting this injustice in court. He has petitioned to re-appeal at the S.C. Supreme Court.
- The state General Assembly has re-filed its Human Life Protection Act, which significantly limits abortion post-conception and protects the lives of mothers.

The South Carolina Catholic Conference, a public policy voice for Catholics, supports these causes and is actively working this legislative session to pass the Human Life Protection Act.
