Letter from our Pastor



An Extraordinary Parish for Ordinary People

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

At Mass, the Church in her sacred liturgy actually prescribes short verses, usually from the scriptures, but sometimes from other ancient texts, to be sung at the entrance, in between the readings, at the offertory and during Communion. These texts are called *antiphons*. In the Middle Ages, as the celebration of daily Mass became more frequent and Mass in general came to be celebrated more frequently, it became harder to get adequate musical staff to do the music actually written by the Church for these moments. And so the phenomenon of Low Mass developed, in which the priest recited the texts of the Mass from the altar. Many churches couldn't carry off the prescribed music, and so it became common to sing *hymns* over top of the recited Low Mass. In Germany, these hymns were paraphrases of the proper antiphons and the ordinary parts of the Mass. The Irish practice of hymns that had little or nothing to do with the antiphons influenced the entire English-speaking Catholic experience all over the world. To such an extent that most people think that you're supposed to sing hymns at Mass.

But in reality, hymns are a foreign importation into the Mass that have absolutely nothing to do with the Mass. Even after the Second Vatican Council, the expectation is that antiphons are sung at Mass, but "another appropriate song may be sung" at those times, according to the rubrics. Before the council, English hymns sung over top of a recited Mass tended to be saccharine, sentimental ditties with little musical artistry. After the council, many of those were just replaced with happy-clappy show tunes with little musical artistry. And so liturgy wars battled over what they considered to be "traditional" or "contemporary" hymns at Mass, when the liturgy itself doesn't even envision hymns at Mass at all! Some of the worst music of the 1970s that was considered "contemporary" at the time is often called "traditional" now. In reality, none of it is traditional or contemporary at all.

The liturgical purist in me wishes we would never sing a hymn again at Mass and just sing the antiphons. But, for better or worse, English hymn singing is such a part of the experience of Catholics in this country, they are here to stay. So if we are going to do them, they need to be chosen for the doctrinal, moral and spiritual value of the texts, as well as their singability. Some of the corpus of hymns we sing at Mass here are from that "traditional" Catholic repertoire: think, "Holy God, we praise Thy Name." The bulk of them come from a repertoire shared by Catholics, Anglicans, Lutherans and Methodists in the English-speaking world, from a time in which most families had a piano and actually spent time singing hymns and reading the Bible outside of church. Many of those hymns I learned from my mother singing them around the house when I was growing up. Others are specifically from the English Catholic milieu that are less known to Americans, but are beautiful melodies wedded to meaningful texts. Finally, every once in a while we adapt a text from an entirely different tradition, such as the Lenten hymn, *O Beloved*, which is actually a Lebanese Maronite hymn for Good Friday wedded to a French melody.

Antiphons are designed by their nature to accompany liturgical action. Hymns are not, and so they often necessitate the interruption of a liturgical action. In some churches, the hymn ends whenever the action it accompanies ends, which means the people are always unsure if they "have" to sing another verse or not. But that's like reading a poem and not reading the whole thing. If we have to do hymns at Mass, it is important to respect it as a literary and musical genre and not mutilate it. So they become in their own way stand alone moments of sung prayer on top of, rather than accompanying, the liturgical action. We sing all the verses of all the hymns. It's the same reason when we have an orchestral Mass, we respect the music and adapt the liturgical action to the way the music was designed to fit into the liturgy when it was written. Either way, don't be afraid to learn new music and to sing it out loud.
