An Extraordinary Parish for Ordinary People

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Last week I mentioned in my bulletin column that *hymns* as such are actually foreign importations into the liturgy that are not really inspired by its nature, and that, if it were up to me, we'd get rid of them. But they have become such a customary part of worship in English-speaking countries, it's hard for most of us to imagine Mass without them. And of course, I do love singing those hymns. I still remember my favorite Sundays growing up as a Baptist kid were the fifth Sunday of every month when the hour or more long sermon was replaced by The Lord's Supper and an hour long hymn sing.

Another aspect of our worship that has become so expected that people can't imagine living without it is pews. Protestants invented pews for people to sit there for long sermons to indoctrinate them away from the Catholic religion. Their rubrics were very simple: stand to sing, kneel to pray and sit for instruction. Catholics in heavily Protestant countries also began to use pews because the preachers of the Catholic Reformation also started preaching long sermons to inoculate their flocks against heresy and schism. Interestingly enough, in Spain, the priests took a different tactic and started the now famous processions that went on and on and in which everyone participated to get people out of the church and visually and aesthetically vaccinate against the iconoclasm of the Reformers.

If you go into most European churches even today, the seats that are there are temporary and easily movable. In most Eastern Catholic or Orthodox churches, there are only a few seats against the back wall for the aged and infirm. But as Low Mass became the norm in Ireland, whose practice influenced the English-speaking world, people got used to kneeling throughout most of Mass and sitting for sermons, and standing, sitting, and kneeling all together in unison as a sign of unity in their Catholic faith. American Catholics have inherited this immobile, fixed and rigid set of postures at Mass they think are traditional, without realizing they are actually both a response and a reaction to Protestantism.

I noticed this on Palm Sunday at 10a, when I had to cajole everyone to get out of their pews and join us for the blessing of palms in the narthex. I asked everyone to follow me in procession, and most people fought those of us in the procession to get back as soon as possible to the safety of "their" pews. It was chaos. But it was also a reminder of two very different strains of Catholic practice: the free flowing, movement of traditional Catholic processional worship; and the rigid, immobilized fixed stance of a Low Mass mentality to worship.

Pews also have another, darker aspect to their history. In many places, pews were actually rented out to certain families, and denied to certain classes of people as they were discriminated against based on race or socioeconomic status. They represented status, wealth and privilege. In the nineteenth century, some very brave Catholic priests and Protestant clergy began to fight with their parishioners to end the practice. To this day, some historic churches in South Carolina have numbers of name plates assigned to them that corresponded to those who paid their pew rent. When the English historian Christopher Dawson converted to Catholicism, his horrified mother's chief objection was he now had to kneel alongside "the help" in church!

If it were up to me, I'd rip all the pews out of the church except for a few for the old and the sick. But I am pretty sure I might actually get run out of town on a rail, and I do like it here, so I'm not going to push the envelope on that one. So, the pews stay. But they do need to be recovered, because after 20 years of candlewax, wear and tear, and baby vomit, they need it. It's one of the many items your Bicentennial Campaign money will go to.
