Dear Brothers and Sisters,

I came across a meme on the internet the other day that caused me to laugh out loud for real but also reflect: Everything happens for a reason. But sometimes the reason is that you're stupid and make bad decisions. We all have an innate desire to escape the consequences of our actions, and only the virtuous and honorable man can stand up with humility and recognize his faults and ask forgiveness for them. But nowadays, many people, even if they can do that, still think they shouldn't have to suffer the consequences of those actions. If we are lucky, a merciful Christian releases us from them and we can gratefully move on with life. But sometimes, God in His providence, seeks to teach us and make us into better people by allowing us to make satisfaction, do penance for our sins, precisely in sitting with and living through the mess we create. Hebrews 12.11: For the moment all discipline seems painful rather than pleasant, but later it yields the peaceful fruit of righteousness to those who have been trained by it.

But in I Peter we read: it is better to suffer for doing good, if that be the will of God, then for doing evil. As much as I don't like it, I can wrap my mind around why we suffer when we have done something wrong. But I really struggle with the fact that sometimes we suffer precisely because of the good we have tried to do, or we find ourselves entangled in some crazy drama, not of our own making, and it brings us incredible hurt and pain. Day in and day out the praying Church commemorates the memorials of the martyrs, of witnesses for Christ who paid the ultimate price for their discipleship, laying down their lives for their belief in the God of Love. As Catholics, the stories of the martyrs become a part of our history, our narrative. We can see them as heroic in the face of the evil, but that nagging voice in the back of my head taunts me: but why does it have to be this way? Why was Maria Goretti violated as a 12 year old girl and murdered by her attacker, who later would be present next to her mother as Pius XII canonized her a saint in 1950 and then die as a humble lay brother in a monastery in 1970? Everything in my mind wants to scream, No! How can the God who reveals Himself as Love permit something like that, and how incredible is the grace which would lead Maria Goretti to forgive Alessandro Serenelli with her last breath as he plunged the knife in her body for the fourteenth time, and led a man who any decent person would see as a scumbag to lead an incredibly holy life?

Yet Our Lord tells us two things that are crucial here: John 12.24: Unless a grain of wheat fall into the ground and dies, it remains alone: but if it dies, it bears much fruit. And then, John 15.13, 15: Greater love has no man than this, than to lay down his life for his friends. I have called you friends. Here is the truly amazing thing: on this earth, friends come into your life and leave them, friends can betray you, stab you in the back, and leave you in a world of hurt: we would be wary of calling anyone like that a true friend. Yet Jesus calls all of us His friends. He wants nothing else than for us to be friends and to live together in harmony and happiness in heaven. And so, in the face of betrayal, of calumny, of murder, he who is the Way, the Truth and the Life stops breathing, His Word is silenced, and He dies.

But you and I both know: that was not the end of the story, was it? Jesus Christ rose from the dead and is alive. He sits in glory at the right hand of the Father in heaven, where He has prepared a place for us to reign with Him. The historical fact, the actual event of the Resurrection, changes everything. There is so much more than what we can touch and see and hear and feel: this natural, mortal life is simply not all there is. Before Jesus, and outside of Jesus, when you die, you were dead, and that was it. The man with the most toys at the end won the game of life. The best you could hope for was that maybe for a generation or two your descendants might remember you. But you went back to the earth whence you came.

Letter from our Pastor, continued

With the Resurrection, all of humanity has, not a second chance, but an immortal destiny. Be ready to give an explanation to anyone who asks for a reason for your hope, but do it with gentleness and reverence, keeping your conscience clear, so that, when you are maligned, those who defame your good conduct in Christ may put themselves to shame. In other words, it is intensely painful when others treat us wrongly? Yes. Does it hurt when someone talks trash about you, ruins your reputation, betrays your trust, misunderstands or rejects your attempts to do good, delivers you up to murder even? Yes.

But the only way to cancel out the cycle of hatred is with love. And Christ has shown that love can afford to die, because it has within it the power to overcome evil and create and recreate something new and indestructible. When the Blessed Virgin and St John stood beneath the Cross, all human reason could see was that the Son of a carpenter from Nazareth had been conquered, and a good man was dead because His friend betrayed Him and His enemies were successful in His demise. But when, three days later, Mary Magdalene went to the tomb, it was empty. The grain of wheat had fallen to the earth and died, but had borne fruit. And when we surrender ourselves to God's mysterious plan for suffering in our lives, even if our bodies die, God can raise us from the dead and do amazing things with our love.

That's why, in the preface to the Eucharistic Prayer of the Funeral Mass, the Church prays, For your faithful people, Lord, life is changed, not ended. That hope cause Paul to write the Romans: Who shall separate us from the love of Christ? Shall tribulation, or distress or famine, or nakedness, or danger, or sword? As it is written, for your sake we are being killed all the day long, we are regarded as sheep to be slaughtered. No, in all these things, we are more than conquerors through Him who loved us. For I am sure that neither death nor life, nor angels nor rulers, nor things present nor things to come, nor powers, nor height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord.

There may be times in your life when you think that the suffering that you are experiencing is really too hard to bear. First of all, remember that it belongs to God to separate the wheat and tears that grow together in the field; and that He is Justice as well as Mercy. The wicked will receive their due, if they do not repent. But, haters gonna hate! In the final analysis, it doesn't matter. If we remain faithful to love, and trust that we will wear the crown of righteousness with Our Lord for all eternity, this time of present trial will pass. I will not leave you orphans, I will come to you. And when He comes to us, we will have everything that is truly worthwhile.
