# An Extraordinary Parish for Ordinary People

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

On the first Saturday of this month I rose even earlier than usual on the day we celebrate First Communion so that I could watch the coronation of King Charles III live on television. My family is of almost completely English heritage on both sides, and even my DNA testing marks me out as something like almost 90% English. My mother was a serious royals watcher, and so I grew up intimately familiar with all of the foibles and glories of the House of Windsor almost as if they were part of our own family's story. Maybe you have to grow up with some serious Anglophilia to get that, but that might explain a lot of things about me! I was interested to see how the coronation would compare to the videos of the same ceremony of Queen Elizabeth II, with which I was familiar from a young age.

There are many people today, and not just in egalitarian republics like our own United States of America, who have a serious allergy to ritual. They think that pomp and circumstance is foreign to the modern mind, and a relic of ages past that should be consigned to the dustbin of history. Even the reformers of the Catholic liturgy in the mid twentieth century strongly felt that the way that our ceremonial had evolved by the time Vatican II came along was far from the simplicity of Nazareth and Jerusalem. They argued that recovering the pristine spirit of the ancient Church meant accretions and encrustations had to go. Leon Gromier, who was one of the Masters of Ceremonies of the Papal Chapel at the time, found himself all of a sudden a distinct minority. He loudly complained, "These people don't even know why the things they are throwing out were there in the first place!" It didn't stop them.

Informality and comfort, as well as a sense that all of this "fancy stuff" as some would call it has nothing to do with the Gospel of Jesus Christ, has led to a situation in which priests and bishops even celebrate the liturgy in the most appallingly cavalier fashion possible. CS Lewis wrote of this tendency, "The modern habit of doing ceremonial things unceremoniously is no proof of humility; rather it proves the offender's inability to forget himself in the rite, and his readiness to spoil for every one else the proper pleasure of ritual." Naïve Christians entertained by bread and circuses often think, "Oh, that's so humble and so poor" not realizing the actual financial and spiritual cost of replacing ritual objects of artistic merit with things which are "simple" in appearance but not in fact.

The Eucharistic Renewal that our bishops want for us is not going to happen unless we return to the reason why religion has ritual, and why Christian ritual is not just historically frozen man-made folderol, but doors to the sacred. That means that we have to be more than passive spectators to it all, but we have to each fulfill our role as baptized Christians deputed to the worship of God.

Now, I don't want to get distracted by a polemic on the way we dress for Mass, but we see a disconnect when the priest is at the altar in special vestments that are blessed and handed down from the worship of the Temple in Jerusalem and Roman court custom and then people at Mass are literally dressed in the same clothes that they wore at the golf course or the beach. Can you imagine if a non-Christian showed up at our liturgy and saw that? What would she gather from that fact? It used to be the case that people wore their "Sunday best" to church on the Lord's Day. You now have people who sarcastically hiss, "Well, I don't think Jesus cares what I wear to church!" at even the slightest hint that maybe we might have gone too far in making the Mass seem like a summer evening at cocktail lounge at a resort. I think the time has come, not to be the fashion police at church, but to really recover and restore a sense of the sacred, not just at the altar, but for all of the royal house of the baptized.
