Letter from our Pastor

An Extraordinary Parish for Ordinary People

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Did you know that this is the emerald anniversary year of our parish school? I remember when it was announced that Prince of Peace was starting a school. I was a seminarian at the time, and quite surprised. In the developing years of the school, the model was to grow a quickly as possible into the largest Catholic school in the area. That is certainly a model, but it also comes with a price. At one point, less than 40% of our students were parishioners, and the Catholic and parochial identity of the school was in danger of being obfuscated by other factors, which, although not necessarily bad in and of themselves, were not the reason the school was founded. We went through a process of reasserting our identity as authentically Catholic, and as a ministry of Prince of Peace. As we look forward to next year with Nathan Barontini as our incoming principal, we are in a very different place. Almost 90% of our students are parishioners going in to next year. Instead of growing uncontrollably, we carefully interview and vet new families during the admissions process to see if they are truly "mission fit" for our school.

Today we have a school that is large enough to be interesting but small enough for everyone to be known and get to do, not some things, but all the things. Small class sizes and individualized attention around a high academic baseline, along with a serious commitment to Catholic identity, marks out the unique experience of our school. Going in to next year, we have waiting lists for a number of the elementary grades, and we are starting a K3 program, a dream for many years! Preference is given to registered, active and contributing parishioners for admissions. We do have openings in middle school, so if you have a rising 5th through 8th grader, I encourage you to take a tour of the school, talk to the staff about the financial aid process, and see the difference before those spots are taken too.

Parents are the primary educators of their children, and we support their choice to do what is best for their child. There are a lot of good options in the area for Catholic, private and even public education, so that means that there is a lot of competition, and schools are all in a race for enrolment of students. Some schools now like to market themselves as "classical" or "STEM" schools, while being quite ambiguous with what they really mean by that and capitalizing on what they think people want. Prince of Peace, both as a parish and school, is dedicated to taking out of the storehouse treasures old and new. And so our approach to education is to take the best of the old and the best of the new.

There are many factors that parents consider when choosing places for their children's education: sports, extracurricular activities, distance, safety features, socialization considerations, diversified learning for gifted or for special needs children. And while those factors are important, a school is an academic institution of intellectual, spiritual and moral formation. Glitz and glamour don't make a school a good one. Do some drilling into the nuts and bolts of what a school is actually all about. Greenville is an up and coming place with a lot of new money. But I caution parents to look beyond superficial and secondary considerations about schooling and make decisions based on what education is best for their children to be saints and leaders for the future.

Let's celebrate our Emerald Anniversary by encouraging every family in the parish who has children ages 3 to 12 to tour the school, have good conversations about it, and see what the possibilities are. Let's make 21 years the year in which every seat in the school is filled with parish children!
