Letter from our Pastor

An Extraordinary Parish for Ordinary People

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

A procession is a holy movement of those truly united. It is a gentle stream of peaceful majesty, not a procession of fists clenched in bitterness, but of hands folded in gentleness. It is a procession which threatens no one, excludes no one, and whose blessing even falls on those who stand astonished at its edge and who look on, comprehending nothing. It is a movement which the holy One, the eternal One supports with his presence; he gives peace to the movement and he gives unity to those taking part in it. The Lord of history and of this holy exodus from exile towards the eternal homeland himself accompanies the exodus.

The above quote was written by the German Jesuit Karl Rahner, one of the giants of twentieth-century theology. Personally, I am not much of a fan of Rahner, because the influence of his theological method has, in my opinion, made the intelligibility of Christian revelation and dogma quite obscure for those who are formed by it. But his writings on the procession for Corpus Christi, which we will observe after the I0a Mass next Sunday, are quite stirring. Pope Benedict XVI, another German theologian, preached in 2008:

Adoring the God of Jesus Christ, who out of love made himself bread broken, is the most effective and radical remedy against the idolatry of the past and of the present. Kneeling before the Eucharist is a profession of freedom: those who bow to Jesus cannot and must not prostrate themselves before any earthly authority, however powerful. We Christians kneel only before God or before the Most Blessed Sacrament because we know and believe that the one true God is present in it, the God who created the world and so loved it that he gave his Only Begotten Son. We prostrate ourselves before a God who first bent over man like the Good Samaritan to assist him and restore his life, and who knelt before us to wash our dirty feet. Adoring the Body of Christ, means believing that there, in that piece of Bread, Christ is really there, and gives true sense to life, to the immense universe as to the smallest creature, to the whole of human history as to the most brief existence.

We ask everyone who calls Prince of Peace a spiritual home to come to the 10a Mass next Sunday and participate in this solemn outdoor Procession of the Most Blessed Sacrament, when we will receive the Blessing of the Eucharistic King at outdoor altars and again at the end. Invite your friends, especially your Catholic ones, and those who may be interested in learning more, to this Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ. Let us profess our belief in the Real Presence by walking with Our Lord and humbly presenting all of the prayers we have in our hearts so that He may grant us benediction as we honor Him. Bring your flowers from home to throw on his path, sing with joy hymns old and new, feast with your senses on the Lord who is beyond all human knowing!
