Letter from our Pastor

An Extraordinary Parish for Ordinary People

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Parents are the primary educators of their children, and it is up to them to make the choices for their children's education and Christian formation that are right for them. The primary apostolate of the parish for the handing on of the Catholic faith is our parish school. We are blessed to have a number of excellent Catholic schools in the area. There are also good private, charter and public options that might be a good place for certain children with specific needs that those schools alone might provide. Many families have also chosen homeschooling, and often gather in various cooperatives to make that easier. Education is changing rapidly, and there are many innovative ideas out there with hybrid models and new methods to teach truth. In a competitive marketplace, people of faith are using their entrepreneurial skills to address the very real needs of their children's schooling.

But there are some darker sides to this situation. In many places in this country, Catholic schools partially or entirely lost their true identity, and became virtually indistinguishable from other schools. Many became cheap private schools with a nod to religion. Faithful Catholics often looked for alternatives, spurred on by the Church's teaching that parents are the primary educators of their children. But where there is an authentic and vibrant Catholic school, one has to ask the question what are the real advantages of not taking part in what is already there, especially when financial aid for demonstrated need is available?

The entrepreneurial spirit has led to a number of great ideas in education that have not really panned out. Just here in Greenville, there have been a number of educational ventures that were great on paper, but ultimately failed. Often these were pet projects of some very enthusiastic individuals or groups, and they met their demise. Why? There was insufficient detail to the reality of running a school and with too many cooks spoiling the broth, disagreements led to fracturing. While the number of Catholics in Greenville is growing, I do think that many people are not reasonable in their assumptions about vitality of emerging Catholic programs and institutions. Instead of putting in the work to grow existing institutions into greater excellence, everyone just wants to do their own thing. And like a fire that spreads too far too fast, without the embers being fed, it dies. The modern obsession with radical individualism fed by pride can cause some exciting new things to come to life, but at the same time risks killing both new and already existing things or imperiling their existence.

I have said this before and I will say it again: we are always better together than apart. The more people unite around existing educational institutions to grow them and make them better, the more possibilities can come to the fore than if, over and over again, time, talent and treasure is squandered on one vanity project after another that is not thought through in terms of its realistic viability and how it will affect others. Growth is good; it needs to be controlled, or otherwise growing pains turn into cancerous agonies. I urge you to be very cautious and circumspect in discerning what new ventures you want to be a part of, and mindful of how every decision you make in this regard has its effect on others. Every child who calls Prince of Peace home should be able to go to school here in a way which meets all of their educational, developmental and spiritual needs. But we can only make that happen if we make it happen, and don't be surprised if I point out dynamics in our community which make that more difficult.
