Letter from Dcn Michael Thompson

An Extraordinary Parish for Ordinary People

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

What is it that separates the Catholic Faith from all the Non Catholic religions? There are many things that I could list, but the ONE thing that would have to be at the very top of the list is the Eucharist. The Catholic Church teaches that during Mass, when the Priest consecrates the bread and wine, they truly become the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ. Although they still have the "accidents" of bread and water, that is they look, smell, feel, taste, and sound (when it is broken) like bread and wine, but through the power of the Holy Spirit, they become the actual Body and Blood of Jesus himself.

In recent history, there have been people that had their doubts about this assertion. However, Father Mike Schmitz points out in his Bible in a Year series, that from the time of Jesus' death until the early 1500's, <u>EVERY</u> Christian was taught and believed that the Eucharist, through Jesus Christ, the Holy Spirit, and the actions of the Priest, was actually and undeniably the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ.

In 1517, Martin Luther began to challenge the authority of the church and the Protestant Reformation was born. Unfortunately, one of the casualties was this universal belief about the Eucharist. As the many different denominations popped up as each group defined what they wanted to believe, the holiness and reverence towards the Holy Eucharist began to fade and completely disappear in some places. Some no longer considered it the Most Holy Body and Blood as Jesus told us it was. Some did not get rid of it altogether, but have it occasionally, but refer to it as a symbol of Jesus.

I met a woman one time that told me she converted to Catholicism because at her church, on the few occasions that they had communion, when they were finished with the service, they would throw the leftovers out for the birds to eat. She said that just didn't feel right. I cringed when I heard that.

And I remember one particular night several years ago when I was up later than usual. I happened to watch a late night show and on the show was a well known actor being interviewed. The topic of faith came up and the host mentioned to this actor that he had heard the actor was a true and devout Catholic. My ears perked up as I had not been accustom to hearing the Catholic faith being talked about in what seemed to be such a positive light. The actor confirmed that he indeed was a staunch believer in the Catholic faith.

Once again, my interest peaked up another notch, maybe two. I actually got out of my chair and moved closer to the television. The next question was, "So as a Catholic, you believe in the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist?" Now I was more than interested, I was excited. In my mind I am saying "This is great, now bring it home and tell the whole world that the Eucharist is the true Body and Blood of Christ!"

Much to my chagrin, the actor greatly disappointed me. As fast as he could, he retreated and said, "Oh no, it is just a symbol." I collapsed back into chair and yelled out "You blew it. You had your big chance to teach the viewing audience the Truth and you blew it". I was thinking he can go back to playing a fake hero in his movies, but he is no hero for the Catholic Faith. Maybe I was too harsh.

My point is, in this world today, there are many people and organizations that want to denounce our Catholic faith. But God gave us His Church and Jesus, at the Last Supper, gave us Himself. Through His Apostles, He told us, "This is My Body " and "This is my Blood." He then commanded us to "Do this in memory of me." This is the source and summit of our faith. This is our belief that we need to hold onto dearly and not let the devil or the world take it away from us. In John 6:53, Jesus tells us, "Amen, amen, I say to you, unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you do not have life within you." Keep the Faith.



a note from fr smith

The church is not the dumping ground for all of the unblessed sacramentals you get in the mail, nor is it the place for you to put your own devotional literature for things you may like. Every week we have to go through the adoration chapel and church and throw away things no one has authorized to be there. Often people get very enthusiastic about some particular devotion, and want to share it by putting thousands of copies of a book or booklet or pamphlet in their church. Now, I encourage you to share your own spiritual life and items which have helped your journey. But I must discourage you from using the parish church as a platform for it. When people pick up things in church, they assume that the parish has authorized it. And so when people pick up pamphlets about unapproved Marian apparitions or polemical literature, they assume the pastor has approved it. And then we get clutter all over the place, and I go on the occasional purge of "Throw all this out" to keep the narthex and chapel tidy.
