Letter from Dcn Michael Cavin

An Extraordinary Parish for Ordinary People

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

As I prepared for my homily this week, I spent time looking on the Internet for resources that would aid me in discussing how to properly prepare for Mass and the reception of Holy Communion. I found that there was no end to the number of articles, posts and reflections on preparation for mass. Upon reflection of these resources, it occurred to me that I was asking the question "How", yet I was ignoring the five "W's" which are also referred to as the journalistic questions. If one jumps straight into "How" without first asking "Who", "What", "Where", "When", and "Why" does the "How" even matter? It is in reflecting upon these 5 W's that we achieve the "How".

To that end we begin by asking the question "Who do we encounter in the Mass"? On a temporal level, we see our fellow Catholics, our Priest, the deacons, the altar servers. But what are they but members of the body of Christ? In the Eucharistic Assembly, which is the Mass, we encounter God.

Now that we know that the "Who" is God, we turn to the "What". The Mass, being the "source and summit of Christian life" (CCC 1324) is a liturgical act. The Second Vatican Council defined the liturgy as "the work of Christ the Priest and of His Body which is the Church." But what are we doing at Mass? We are offering a sacrifice to God. United with the One Sacrifice that Christ made on Calvary, made present for us again in an unbloody manner, we offer ourselves unto God the Father. Placing ourselves on the Patent and in the Chalice as oblations.

The easy answer to the question "Where" is of course in Church, or wherever Mass is being offered. However, it is important to note that while the Mass you are attending may have been offered in Taylors, SC that during the sacrifice we are united with every other Mass being offered throughout the world in the One Sacrifice of Calvary.

The next question "When" can be looked at in several different ways. First off, the Precepts of the Church dictate that we attend Mass on Sundays and on Holy Days of Obligation. This, however, doesn't mean that we must receive communion on the same frequency. While, receiving the Eucharist often is good for the soul we are only obligated to receive our Lord once a year during the Easter Season. We should receive our Lord often, but only in a State of Grace and after careful preparation. Additionally, just like the answer to "Where" in which we understand that we are united with every other Mass throughout the world, we are also united with every of Mass offered throughout time.

This begs to answer the question "Why". Why do we do any of this? We do this to return to God what is His and His alone. We are His! God loved us so much that he offered His only begotten Son. We attend Mass to offer our Adoration, our Thanksgiving, our Atonement, and our Petitions. We attend Mass to offer our Love.

Now we have finally come to the "How". Well, the answer is simple, Reflect and pray on the "Who", "What", "Where", "When", and "Why" throughout the week. Now, I know I didn't cover the basic mechanics of Fasting at least I hour before receiving communion, going to confession if knowledgeable of mortal sin, and looking at the Readings for Mass beforehand. But does that really require an entire article in the Bulletin?

a note from fr smith

The church is not the dumping ground for all of the unblessed sacramentals you get in the mail, nor is it the place for you to put your own devotional literature for things you may like. Every week we have to go through the adoration chapel and church and throw away things no one has authorized to be there. Often people get very enthusiastic about some particular devotion, and want to share it by putting thousands of copies of a book or booklet or pamphlet in their church. Now, I encourage you to share your own spiritual life and items which have helped your journey. But I must discourage you from using the parish church as a platform for it. When people pick up things in church, they assume that the parish has authorized it. And so when people pick up pamphlets about unapproved Marian apparitions or polemical literature, they assume the pastor has approved it. And then we get clutter all over the place, and I go on the occasional purge of "Throw all this out" to keep the narthex and chapel tidy.


