Letter from our Pastor

An Extraordinary Parish for Ordinary People

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

One of the things that I am happy to see is that many Catholics are once again reading some of the spiritual classics and lives of the saints that have inspired countless souls to holiness over history. In doing so, they discover, often by reading, an entire culture where spiritual practices and devotions were everywhere. They long for that Catholic culture here, and they naturally look to their priests for guidance in making their parish a center that culture and helping them on their way to glory. That longing is wonderful, and the fact that so many people want that is one of the many reasons why I love our parish.

At the same time, however, we have to remember that the world that we are reading about was in a place and time that is no longer. We live in South Carolina in 2023, not sixteenth century France. What was appropriate or possible then is not always appropriate or possible now. We read about a time in which many people walked to church, their priest knew every person in a village that was entirely Catholic and could walk to their house, and there were monks and friars and nuns and sisters in convents as well as a plethora of Catholic institutions all over the place. Even in the United States, the Church built up many places like this. I think there is a historical memory of that greatness, and an expectation that this is what the Church should look like.

But this is not the case in South Carolina, and never has been. When Our Lady appeared in 1925 to encourage people to go to confession and communion on First Saturdays, Portugal was almost 100% Catholic. There were plenty of parish priests to go around, parishes were just places for worship, and monasteries and religious houses abounded everywhere so that people had ample opportunities to deepen their faith. Just twenty-five years later, the diocese in which Fatima is located had 1451 Catholics per priest while Charleston had 173 Catholics per priest. That sounds great until you realize that 94.3% of the population in Fatima was Catholic as opposed to 0.9% in Charleston. Catholics in South Carolina had only 42 parishes for a territory of 31,200 square miles, while Fatima had 61 parishes for 650 square miles. As of 2021, Fatima has 1572 Catholics per priest in 73 parishes while Charleston has 1285 Catholics per priest for 94 parishes. The Catholic percentage of the population in Fatima is 85.7% while in Charleston it is 3.7%.

I present to you all of the math here to encourage you to realize that we live in mission territory, and we have to be realistic about the ability of parish staff and clergy to offer a Catholic life as if we were living in a very different place and time. There are only so many hours in the day, and only so many resources in terms of manpower and money to do them. Parishes, especially with schools, operate like businesses today and that requires a very different approach to ministry than would have been the case a century ago in a Catholic culture.

I appreciate the desire for "more" but unless more people wanting more translates into more priests, more institutions, more hours in the day and more resources to do more, those desires are going to be frustrated. Again, I remind you: this is a mission parish in a mission territory. The infrastructure for a Catholic culture that supports much of what some people seem to want does not exist here. That infrastructure, where existed in the past, is breaking apart and disappearing at an alarming rate, and took centuries to build.

Instead of sending me more emails starting, "I know you're busy, but..." with more, more, more, why not ask, "If God wants this, do I have faith that He will make it happen, in His time and according to His plan?" The obsession with more is a form of gluttony, but more on that in next week's column.


