Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

The Diocese of Charleston was founded in 1820; the now Archdiocese of Kampala in Uganda was founded as the Vicariate Apostolic of Nyanza in 1880. In 1959, Uganda was 49% Catholic, while South Carolina was 1.3% Catholic. Today, Uganda is still 41% Catholic and we are 3.8% Catholic. We had a sixty year start over this country in sub-Saharan Africa, with people who were already Christians, and money and resources that the missionaries who went to Kampala could never have dreamed of. The natives killed a number of missionaries, and diseases killed even more. They were animists who believed in false gods. But here we are now, and Catholicism has made much greater advances there than it has here.

Does that bother you? What was the difference? Why is South Carolina not 41% Catholic now? And what are we doing about it? That's it. That's the message.






