# Letter from our Pastor

# An Extraordinary Parish for Ordinary People

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

One of the most beautiful cities in the world was Smyrna in Turkey, now known as Izmir. A vibrant, cosmopolitan city saw commerce, trade and culture at the end of the 19<sup>th</sup> and beginning of the 20<sup>th</sup> centuries to such an extent that it was known all over the world. Christians and Muslims from a dizzying array of languages, cultures, and traditions lived side by side in relative peace and harmony for centuries. The average Smyrniot could go back and forth between several languages and knew a lot about the various cultures that made up this unique city. The city was a beacon of cooperation and tolerance, as well as technology and progress, and the fortunes of the city seemed on the up and up.

But storm clouds gathered around this oasis of peace. The Greeks had won their independence from the Ottoman Empire with the Megala Idea, the Great Idea of uniting all ethnic Greeks in one homeland. As the Ottoman Empire ran out of gas, various forces within the empire fought with each other as to what should replace it and what it would look like. Ethnic and religious minorities, which were actually quite substantial in terms of power and influence, dreamed of their own nations freed from the imperial paradigm. After World War I, the Allied Powers sought to carve up the territory for their own agendas and purposes. And the Turks sought to protect their land from the forces they saw as intent on destroying them.

The Greco-Turkish War that broke out as those tensions boiled over, ended in what Winston Churchill described as a tragedy with "few parallels in the history of human crime." By 13 September 1922, Greek forces had retreated from Smyrna and refugees sought to flee as the Turkish forces recaptured the city. Although Smyrna was filled with diplomats, their respective countries told them not to intervene in what was billed as a squabble between two countries that they had no part in.

All hell broke loose. Massacres happened everywhere and the city caught on fire. Thousands upon thousands rushed upon the battery all at the same time to try to get on the very few ships that could take them to safety. By the time the smoke cleared, literally thousands of people were dead by fire and drowning, and one of the most beautiful cities in the modern world was completely destroyed.

During my travels in Turkey several years ago, I stood on the Kordon in Izmir where this human tragedy took place. While the city has been rebuilt, and to this day has a more international and cosmopolitan character than any other town in the country, it is not what it once was. I had the weird feeling that this city on the sea felt a lot like Charleston. And then, the terrifying thought came to me: What if this happened again?

Our country is polarized, violence is increasingly commonplace, sectarian and political divisions seem to be more important to many than our shared humanity, all while we live in relative luxury and comfort compared with the rest of the world. I don't want to sound apocalyptic, but what happened in Smyrna could also happen in Charleston, or Greenville, or New York or Paris. As I have read about what happened in Smyrna, I keep asking myself, How could this have been avoided? Where did it all go wrong? How do you rebuild from the ashes?

Smyrna My Beloved is an interesting movie for adults from the Greek point of view released last year, now finally available on Apple TV. I watched this movie after having read much about the history of this time period. Smyrna is where the Apostle John, the Beloved Disciple, sent his young protégé, Polycarp, to be the first bishop. A city mentioned in Revelation I.II, and not far from where St John lived at Ephesus with the Blessed Mother. The Christian presence literally 100 years ago was very strong, and the Latin Catholic Cathedral is now one of the few remnants of that time period left. Are we too proud to see that, if we continue on our present path to hate, Prince of Peace might one day be the last vestige of Christian culture left after the destruction of human tragedy?


