Letter from our Pastor

An Extraordinary Parish for Ordinary People

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

As Catholics, we believe in a culture of life that flows from a civilization of love. But the tragedy of the culture of death casts its shadow even amidst the Church. There are many families in our pews today whose lives have been marked in some way by abortion. Grandparents who never held their grandchild; fathers who never knew they were dads until it was too late; mothers who were coerced by their own mothers to abort their child because it would supposedly destroy their life; health care workers who have had to care for a woman after a morning after pill gone terribly wrong. The landscape of the fight against abortion has changed significantly just in the past few years.

What has not changed is that there are many people even in our own faith community whose lives have been affected by the loss of abortion who need healing. But where do they go?

I would like for all of you who call Prince of Peace a spiritual home to go to <u>www.supportafterabortion.com</u>. There is a lot there in terms of research about what is happening in this realm now, as well as resources that anyone can go to for what can be constructive and helpful in this regard. If the Church is truly to be a place of healing, we need to be able to direct those who have been affected by abortion to resources that can assist in that, not just spiritual, but also mental health resources.


