Letter from our Pastor

An Extraordinary Parish for Ordinary People

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

You may not know this, but not one family pays the full cost of what it takes to educate a child at Prince of Peace Catholic School. Fundraising efforts and direct parish subsidy make the tuition cost much lower than it would be if those elements were not part of the mix. In addition to that, 45% of the families of our school receive some kind of tuition assistance based on financial aid. The pot that we have for financial aid does not always meet 100% of demonstrated financial need, because those funds are also limited.

The Annual Fund is an opportunity to give directly to the school, which remains the principal apostolate of the parish for handing on the Catholic faith. We ask that every family who calls Prince of Peace a spiritual home participate in the Annual Fund is some way. There are numerous grants available that are often tied to how invested a community is in the Annual Fund, and generous participation in the Fund also shows how much the parish values its chief ministry. Even if you don't have a child in the school, it is part of the cate-chetical and evangelization mission of the parish.

The Annual Fund is often used for quick impact items as well as helping to get families through difficult times which often come up in the middle of the year after financial aid has already been allocated. Every year the budgeting process is based on a certain number of students enrolled. During every year, there is attrition due to students moving out of the area, deciding that POPCS is not the right fit for them, or disciplinary actions. Every year, students are registered and then don't actually show up on the first day of school, which happens after the budget is approved, so revenue goes down by each student as expenses often remain the same. The difference has to be made up somewhere, and fundraising and increased parish subsidy is how that difference is made up. Generally, that happens in a way which is planned for to a reasonable extent to predict certain contingencies. But, as you know in your own life, emergencies and unforeseen situations often arise and you have to address the financial impact of those situations.

We ask that every family consider a sacrificial gift to the Annual Fund this year. Please reach out to Mr Barontini, our principal, to learn more if you have questions.

year b begins soon

Did you know the Lectionary is arranged in two cycles, one for Sundays and one for weekdays? The Sunday cycle is divided into three years, labeled A, B and C. In Year A, we read mostly from the Gospel of Matthew. In Year B, we read the Gospel of Mark and chapter 6 of the Gospel of John. In Year C, we read the Gospel of Luke. The Gospel of John is read during the Easter season in all three years. The year of the cycle does not change on January I, but on the First Sunday of Advent which is the beginning of the liturgical year.

The first reading, usually from the Old Testament, reflects important themes from the Gospel reading. The second reading is usually from one of the epistles, a letter written to an early church community. These letters are read semi-continuously. Each Sunday, we pick up close to where we left off the Sunday before, though some passages are never read.

We begin year B readings in the St Isaac Jogues Missals on 3 December.

OF christ the king




eucharistic conference in April - act now
