Letter from our Pastor, Fr Christopher Smith

An Extraordinary Parish for Ordinary People

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

As Catholics, we are the both/and, not the either/or religion. Faith and reason, faith and works, scripture and tradition: the list goes on and on. When the Second Vatican Council reformed the sacred liturgy, the Church also said that worship should be in both Latin and the vernacular. Not either Latin or the vernacular. Some people got the false idea that the Mass used to be in Latin, and now it is in English. The liturgical books reformed after Vatican II can be celebrated in Latin or English, but the Church requires, instructs and commands her pastors to make sure the faithful can participate in Mass in both the language of the Church as well as in their mother tongue.

In the Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy of 1962 we read:

- 36. The use of the Latin language is to be preserved in the Latin rites.
- 54. In Masses which are celebrated with the people, a suitable place may be allotted to their mother tongue . . . Nevertheless steps should be taken so that the faithful may also be able to say or to sing together in Latin those parts of the Ordinary of the Mass which pertain to them.
- 116. The Church acknowledges Gregorian chant as specially suited to the Roman liturgy: therefore, other things being equal, it should be given pride of place in liturgical services.
- In Musicam sacram, which governs the Church's regulations on sacred music, we read:
- 47. Pastors of souls should take care that besides the vernacular "the faithful may also be able to say or sing together in Latin those parts of the Ordinary of the Mass which pertain to them."

The mind of the Church is very clear: the Mass is to be sung, in Latin, and in Gregorian chant. Now that doesn't mean that other things can't also be sung, but the patrimony of the Church has pride of place, and pastors are to make sure their people can do this. Unfortunately, these directives of the Church have been so ignored in this country that we now have generations of Catholics who have been denied their own heritage by their own priests, and they think that it is supposed to be that way. In Rome, pilgrims from all over the world come together and invariably it is the Americans who sit there mute while everyone else knows how to participate in the prayers of the Church in the language of the Church. The Our Father and the Creed are known by millions all over the world in Latin chant, but Americans are still far behind. How is this possible unless priests are not doing their job?

When I arrived here twelve years ago this week, the new translation of the Roman Missal into English had just arrived. We all had to learn to recite a new version of the prayers, and we have also learned to sing the ordinary parts of the Mass in the new wording. We have learned two versions of the Kyrie, Gloria, Sanctus and Agnus Dei and one version of the Creed. At the 5p and 10a Masses we have also learned two Kyries in Greek and one Gloria, as well two Sanctus and Agnus Dei settings in Latin. Two. Only two out of eighteen provided for us by the Church! At the 12N Mass, they have mastered those settings as well as three Creeds and about five other settings of the Mass. The School Mass has also learned the Our Father and the Memorial Acclamation in Latin.

Sometimes people will say to me, "I don't know what the Sanctus means" and then literally recite it for me word for word perfectly in English. It is exactly the same thing! We really have to get past this illogical mental block against Latin at Mass. We have school children who can barely read who can sing many of the parts of the Mass from memory in Latin as well as in English. If they can do it, so can you. But you have to actually want to do what the Church expects us to do, and leave aside the attitude which says, "I am going to do what I want at Mass."

fourth sunday of advent & christmas

Get ready for back-to-back Fourth Sunday of Advent & Christmas Masses this year! The Fourth Sunday of Advent is Sunday, 24 December. Christmas follows the next day. Both are days of obligation. Therefore, we have two obligations to fulfill – we must go to two distinct Masses. For the purposes of fulfilling one's obligation, the hymns, readings, prayers, or vestment color of the Mass have no bearing. The obligation is to attend any Mass within the timeframe allowed.

That means, for the Fourth Sunday of Advent, you can go to any Mass between 4p on Saturday, 23 December and 11:59p on Sunday, 24 December.

For Christmas, you can go to any Mass between 4p on Sunday, 24 December 24 and 11:59pm on Monday, 25 December.



- Monday, I January: 10a & 12p Latin




Celebrating Advent

An Extraordinary Parish for Ordinary People

The Christmas season is a time for holiday cheer, friends and family. As Catholic Christians, we have a unique way of celebrating Jesus, Who is the reason for our season.

- **Confession** before Christmas is encouraged in Catholicism to purify the soul and embrace the spiritual renewal symbolized by Jesus' birth. "Confession heals, confession justifies, confession grants pardon of sin, all hope consists in confession; in confession there is a chance for mercy." -St. Isidore of Seville
 - We will follow our usual Confession Schedule with additional opportunities. See the schedule here.
- Attend Rorate Mass, a traditional Catholic Advent service celebrated before dawn, focusing on the anticipation of Christ's birth, often lit only by candlelight. See the schedule here.





- Put up a Nativity Scene. In Advent, the three wisemen should be stationed far away from the central figures of Mary and Joseph. And the Baby Jesus too should not be displayed yet. As Advent unfolds, day by day have someone ideally a small child in your family move the wisemen closer to the Holy Family. On Christmas Eve, put the Baby Jesus in the manger and say the traditional family prayer to bless the Nativity scene. Keep advancing the wisemen until 6 January, the Feast of the Epiphany, when they finally arrive to adore the newborn King. Children should know the difference between Christmas and the Epiphany and understand the 12 Days of Christmas are those between the two feasts not the 12 days leading up to Christmas.
- The Jesse Tree is a traditional Advent practice in Catholicism. It involves displaying a tree or a branch decorated with symbols or ornaments representing biblical stories and figures from Jesus' genealogy. Each day leading up to Christmas, a new ornament or symbol is added, recounting the lineage of Jesus through Jesse, the father of King David. It serves as a visual and devotional way to reflect on the anticipation and preparation for the birth of Jesus while connecting to the broader narrative of salvation history. Learn more and get the graphics. Or, here's a coloring book for young children.
- Read Fr Smith's recommended Advent Reading, which he explains caveats about in his pastoral letter here.
- <u>Check out these family-friendly ideas</u> on how to celebrate Advent in your home from our Catholic Identity Committee of the parish school.
- Celebrate the saints with feast days during Advent, especially St Lucy on 13 December (here's how)
- Ember Days are set aside to pray and offer thanksgiving for a good harvest and God's blessings. If you are in good health, fast on the Wednesday, Friday, and Saturday immediately following the Feast of St. Lucy on 13 December (that means 20, 22 and 23 December)
- The Blessing of Expectant Mothers is on Gaudete Sunday, 17 December, at 10a and 12n Mass.
- **Pray the O Antiphons** as part of Vespers on 17-23 December. Each of the titles of the O Antiphons addresses Jesus with a special title given to the Messiah and refers to a prophecy from the Prophet Isaiah. <u>Listen to the O Antiphons chanted here.</u> Or, <u>print this prayer companion</u> for home.
- **Bless your Christmas tree!** Here are the <u>prayers</u> to be said on Christmas Eve, which is when your tree should be put up. Use candy canes in your decor read about the <u>meaning of the sweet treat here</u>.
