Letter from our Pastor, Fr Christopher Smith



An Extraordinary Parish for Ordinary People

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

You have heard me say often a sentence that I am beginning to regret formulating the way that I have in the past: We will bless anything that moves, and even doesn't move. The Church in her public liturgy has formularies for all kinds of people, places and things to set them apart for the worship of God, and those sacramentals, used with faith, can be powerful vehicles for the grace of God. There are thousands of these blessings that are part of our tradition. Some of them we do publicly as part of our common life, and others we do privately when asked. But sometimes people come to ask for blessings for things and I have to say, "No, we're not doing that..." And they look at me bewildered and say, "But you said...."

Two examples come to mind. First of all, the Bible. People will ask me to bless their Bibles. But the Word of God blesses us, we don't bless it. I will give a blessing to those who read the Bible, that they may be blessed. Second of all, it has become customary in some places to bless bookbags for kids at the beginning of school. Yet, what do you do with that bookbag at the end of the school year? You throw it out into the trash. Is that where a blessed object should go? There is a reason why the Church that has blessings for so many things, doesn't have one for that. The Advent Wreath is a domestic custom that comes from the Germanic Lutheran tradition that has slowly crept into Anglo and even Mediterranean-Hispanic environments, but the Church's relatively new blessing for it, authorized for use in the United States, doesn't bless the wreath but people who gaze upon the wreath. Why? Because you're going to throw it away on 25 December!

It is a reminder that blessings are part of the public worship of the Church and when they are celebrated publicly, they must respect the liturgical texts and norms legitimate authority allows for. Even when celebrated privately, they still have a reference point in that discipline and tradition. There are so many blessings and sacramentals, and we should celebrate them and use them, but we do have to be careful that we don't impose our own creativity to bless any and everything willy-nilly.

A recent phenomenon that has been seen in Protestant churches as well as some Catholic churches is to be seen at the beginning of Lent: Ashes on the Go. It seems like a good idea: go out into public spaces with ashes and distribute ashes to people. A great initiative of the New Evangelisation, right? Except that the ashes come from the palms blessed on Palm Sunday, and the Lenten journey has a unity from beginning to culmination. Also, remember the history of ashes. In ancient times, they were imposed by the Bishop upon public penitents who were expelled from the Church for grave sins and reconciled to the entire community at a special Mass on Maundy Thursday. The point is the ashes are not just a freebie to hand out to anyone: they are ordered to penance within the Eucharistic community and have their reference point in the Mass! While the Church allows the imposition of ashes outside of Mass for grave pastoral reasons, it doesn't mean the mind of the Church is to just run around ashing people all over the place because, well, we can. One of the weirder things that I am seeing now that I hesitate to call an abuse but which is still so weird is the obsession with extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion insisting on bringing ashes to sick and homebound people, or people randomly appearing at the Church door all day on Ash Wednesday demanding ashes. Think about it: *demanding a sign of penance apart from the journey of Lent that ends up in the Eucharist.* Nothing could be farther from the mindset of the Church that is actually expressed in the prayers that surround the blessing of ashes and the Mass of Ash Wednesday.

When a healthy and theologically appropriate attitude towards blessings and sacramentals is replaced by sentimentality, we obscure the authentic meaning of these means of divine grace. The priest is not a gatekeeper to keep people out of more possibilities for grace, but he is a steward of the divine mysteries, and as such we must ensure that eccentric, superstitious or abusive use of sacraments and sacramentals does not overtake their true and inner meaning, which is so much more transformative when part and parcel of a life in Christ.
