

Dear Friends in Christ,

I am celebrating twelve years here at Prince of Peace this December and I have never been as excited to deliver a financial report to you as I am this year. The fiscal year that ended on 30 June 2023 was one of tremendous growth and activity here at Prince of Peace. As you will see, our Offertory increased considerably along with the average number of people coming to Mass every Sunday. In an age in which Catholic churches all over our country are closing, and the ones that remain often struggle to thrive, this is a great testament to how much you believe in your parish. Now, you will see that expenses are up considerably as well. Everything costs more as we experience the effects of inflation! But our increased offertory, as well as the proceeds from the Bicentennial Campaign, have allowed us to move far down the list of a number of capital improvement projects to the church, rectory and campus buildings that otherwise might have languished for years and had been identified for years as needing to be done.

To me one of most important of these improvements has been to the security of the buildings. Surveillance systems and access control technology have advanced a lot in recent years, and the physical safety of those on campus is increased by our investing in them. The fact is, we have more people here for more hours a day and more activities going on. Now, the actual number of registered households is down while the number of people attending Mass is up. Why? Well, we have been very proactive at culling the inactive households. Many people who come to Mass here are not registered, or are registered in other parishes, even if they give to Prince of Peace!

The primary apostolate of the parish for the handing on of the Catholic faith is our parish school. The enrollment situation in the school continues to improve steadily, although there is a critical need to increase our middle school numbers even as elementary is doing very well. One of the things that was unusual about going into this current fiscal year is that a number of families registered and paid their fees, but did not end up actually coming for a whole variety of ostensibly understandable reasons. This puts a serious stress on the school budget, because staffing and programming decisions are made in the previous academic and fiscal year based on the registration number. That said, the school's financial position is solid and our parish support of their good work is unwavering.

The current school enrollment situation, a slight slowing of current growth compared with FY22-23's parish revenue and parishioner numbers, and inflation means that, even though the year reported here was fantastic, as we mature into the current year, we need everyone who calls Prince of Peace their spiritual home to do their part. If we are to deliver what you have become accustomed to at Prince of Peace, and improve on that, every registered household must prayerfully consider if their giving reflects the expectation of the Bible tithe. We usually give the formula: 10% = 5% to the weekly offertory, 1% to the Bishop, and 4% to the charity of your choice, in which we encourage you to privilege the corporate initiatives of the parish such as St Vincent de Paul and the Bicentennial Campaign. Online giving makes this much easier than it used to be, but we do have to get it done! Thank you for an incredible year and thank you in advance for your investment now in the future! There's much we can do together!

Dear Parishioners,

Prince of Peace is devoted to our mission of Catholic formation, fellowship, evangelization, service, and worship. By remaining committed to these core principles, our parish has and will continue to grow and flourish.

We are pleased to provide the results for the fiscal year ending 30 June 2023 and the Budget for the next fiscal year. This past year's performance was definitely impressive as we increased our offertory to \$1.745M or \$95K above Budget and \$145.0K above the prior year – that is a 5.8% increase to Budget and 9.1% increase over the prior year – another incredible year and thank you so much for your continuing generosity!! Without that generous support from the weekly offertory and the quarterly proceeds from the Bicentennial Campaign (\$47.2K received during FY23), we would not have been able to maintain the campus while making necessary capital improvements. In FY24, we have budgeted a 5.0% increase in offertory over FY23.

Prince of Peace Catholic School, our parish's primary apostolate, had another successful year with enrollment reaching about 180 students at the end of FY23. The parish was able to provide support to the school of \$126K during FY23. Under the new leadership of Principal Nathan Barontini, the parish has budgeted \$150K of support to the school for FY24.

In addition to the normal parish administrative, operational and maintenance expenses found on the income statement and the parish support of the school described above, we had another active year with required capital expenditures across the campus. FY23 net capital expenditures totaled \$331K which were made for our parish's long-term future including replacing the 20-ton Energy Recovery Unit (ERU) and a 12-ton HVAC compressor, both on the church, improved campus-wide Security/Access Control, external pole lighting improvements, IT/Sound/Live Streaming equipment upgrades, in addition to some new ecclesiastical furnishings plus some Rectory and other campus projects.

We are truly grateful to our parish and school staff and our faith-filled volunteers who make our church and school community such an outstanding place of worship and education for our children – and most especially to you, our parishioners, who continue to graciously support both the parish and school during these troubling times and allow us to bring outstanding things to life at Prince of Peace, our Spiritual Home.







Financial Highlights

- Total Parish Revenue of \$1,915K was \$132K or 7.4% favorable to Budget and \$168K or 9.6% favorable to prior fiscal year.
- ◆ Total Offertory of \$1,745K was \$95K or 5.8% favorable to Budget and \$145K or 9.1% higher than the prior fiscal year; Designated Offerings of \$77K were \$2K favorable to Budget and \$1K lower than the prior year.
- Other Income of \$69K was \$20K favorable to Budget, and \$12K favorable to the prior fiscal year.
- Salaries & Benefits of \$809K were \$3K favorable to Budget; Administrative expenses combined with Church/Rectory expenses were within \$5K of Budget.
- Operations expense of \$201K was \$7K unfavorable to Budget.
- Utilities expense of \$85K were \$3K favorable to Budget and \$12K higher than prior fiscal year.
- Repairs and Maintenance of \$107K were higher than Budget by \$17K and prior year by \$12K as we continue to make repairs and maintain our active campus.
- The Parish generated a surplus of \$86K, mostly used for needed capital items.
- ◆ Fixed Asset increases totaled \$331.4K in FY23; Half of the planned Church HVAC replacement was completed in FY23 for \$136.3K; \$75.3K was added for improved campus-wide Security/Access Control; \$21.6K was spent for pole lighting improvements; IT/Sound/Live Streaming equipment totaled \$58.6K; Ecclesiastical Furnishings increased by \$8.9K; \$13K for Rectory and All Other was ~ \$5K.
- ♦ Withdrawal of \$136K from Diocesan Savings to fund planned Church HVAC project.
- Parish support to the school of \$126K was within \$8K of Budget; FY24 support of the School by the Parish is budgeted for \$150K.
- The balance sheet at June 30, 2023 shows cash of \$598K in checking and savings including \$526K in capital reserves.
- The FY24 Budget forecasts Parish Offertory of \$1.83M, an increase of 5.0% over FY23; Concerns remain for the impact of inflation.







Financial Highlights

- ♦ Total Tuition & Fees, Net increased by 1.6% from FY22 to FY23 Actual.
- ♦ Total Tuition & Fees, Net increases by 9.5% in the FY24 Budget from FY23 Actual.
- Actual enrollment has increased from 173 in FY22 to 180 in FY23. FY24 Budget is based on enrollment of 180.
- FY23 had \$32.0K write-off for tuition non-payment (including \$21.8K from prior years) versus FY22 which had \$15.3K tuition write-off.
- ♦ FY23 Cash (including savings) of \$416K was up from FY22 of \$328K.
- ♦ FY24 Budget provides \$33K surplus for the school at 180 student enrollment.
- FY23 Actual enrollment was 180.
- ♦ FY24 Budget assumes a nurse and a learning specialist funded this year by the
- Parish support to the school of \$126K was higher than Budget by about \$8K and \$16K lower than prior year. The school's solid financial position allowed the use of a cap which was \$118K in FY23 with the school funding the overage (\$8K).
- Parish support to the school of \$150K is funded for the FY24 Budget.
