Letter from our Pastor, Fr Christopher Smith



## An Extraordinary Parish for Ordinary People

#### Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

St Pius X was famous for saying, "Don't sing at Holy Mass, sing Holy Mass!" When he was a parish priest in a village in northern Italy, he noticed all kinds of what he thought were strange behaviors at Mass: some women would just go from statue to statue in the church praying the rosary, some of the men would go in and out of the church repeatedly for a smoke break or to chat with their buddies, the choir would sing arias inspired by operas popular at the time, and sometimes people would sing these saccharine, sentimental hymns that had nothing to do with any of the texts of the Mass. He reflected on the fact that here he was, at the altar, reading the scriptures and saying the prayers of the public worship of the Church, which were so superior in their meaning and power to transform than anything else in the Christian life, and his people just ignored it.

Has much changed since then? I know for a fact that there are many places in Italy where it hasn't. As a seminarian, I remember watching in horror as soccer balls and artichokes were brought up along with bread and wine in the offertory procession, altar boys wrestling each other in front of the pulpit while the priest ignored them preaching, and the *Our Father* was sung in Italian according to the melody of Simon and Garfunkel's *The Sound of Silence*. Even recently, a red hot furore was unleashed when a priest celebrated Mass literally in the Mediterranean Sea in his bathing suit on top of an inflatable mattress. As if anyone needs to see a priest with his dadbod naked torso anywhere, much less at Mass! I never looked for the throw up emoji so fast in my life to express my reaction on social media.

America was notorious for a "Low Mass culture." Remember that Catholic culture in this country was shaped in large part by the Irish. While they were being persecuted by the English Protestants, they were forced for centuries to say Mass clandestinely on rocks and in hiding places, often with no music at all, or just music that mimicked popular tunes. They looked at the Anglicans, their oppressors, with their pipe organs and boys choirs and polyphonic music and stately hymns as the polar opposite of what it meant to be Catholic, even though all of those things had been a part of the Catholic tradition in the British Isles when England was still Mary's Dowry before it was wrested away from the Barque of Peter. In the 1960s, Americans just replaced the four-hymn sandwich of sappy sentimental hymns based on "O Danny Boy" (which I have actually heard at a Catholic funeral before: insert appropriate emoji here) with a four-hymn sandwich of sacropop tunes. I know some of you know that old standard of Amchurch shlock called *Here I am, Lord.* Are you also aware that is also a melodic plagiarism of the theme song for the TV show *The Brady Brunch*?

When you're used to bad eating habits and junk food, getting used to a healthy diet that can actually nourish you is hard. American Catholics have gotten way too comfortable with bad liturgy, bad music, bad preaching, bad spiritual formation and bad theology. And the even sadder thing is that many people can no longer tell the difference between what is bad and what is good. The Church in her documents on worship and music reminds her children that Latin remains the language of the Church, Gregorian chant sung by the people has pride of place, polyphonic settings of the treasury of sacred music are a patrimony for civilisation, and the pipe organ is be held in the highest esteem among all the possible instruments other than the human voice. Let's build that kind of culture here at Prince of Peace together. Sing the Mass. Sing at Mass. And let's contribute to that true Catholic culture of worship!

### candlemas is 2 february

Candlemas, also known as the Feast of Light, is a day of purification, renewal, and hope. On this day, exactly 40 days after Christmas, we commemorate Mary's obedience to Mosaic law by submitting herself to the temple for the ritual of purification, as commanded in Leviticus 12:2-8.

There will be blessing of candles at Candlemas on Friday, 2 February. Masses will be 8.30a (English) and 7p (Latin).

Candles should be placed on the table inside the communion rail before Mass. You may either bring your own candles to be blessed or you can purchase candles from the parish office.

If you purchase candles from the parish office:

- Price: There are 2-8" candles in a box for \$5.
- **Receipt:** On 2 February, the candles purchased will be placed on the table inside the communion rail with your name on the box.
- How to purchase: Place your order in the collection basket and be sure to write Candlemas candles on the envelope with your name.
