Letter from our Pastor, Fr Christopher Smith

An Extraordinary Parish for Ordinary People

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Last Sunday I woke up for Mass with my mind racing in a million different directions as usual, and I got a message that stopped me in my tracks. Two masked and armed gunmen entered the Church of Santa Maria in Büyükdere, a district of Istanbul, at the consecration of the Mass and began to shoot in the air. A 52 year old Muslim man with cognitive issues who was preparing for baptism as a Christian stood up to the men to ask them to leave while everyone else was crouching down on the ground. He was shot in front of members of his own family who had brought him to Mass and in front of the entire congregation. ISIS, the militant Islamic group, claimed responsibility for the shooting, and a Russian and a Tajik were arrested not even twenty-four hours later.

I had just been to visit that church on my last visit to the city on the very happy occasion of the 800th anniversary of the giving of the Rule of St Francis. I cannot imagine being the parish priest, Fr Anton, standing behind the altar helpless at what happened. Turkey has a very active counter-terrorist operation, and the war in Gaza had them on high alert. But unfortunately, this tragedy happened. A martyr was baptized in blood before he could be baptized in water and the Holy Spirit for standing up to hatred, all at the time in which the wine was to become the very Blood of Christ that brings peace and remission of sins. Cihan Tuncer will be enrolled in the list of those who laid down their lives for their neighbor. One of God's special little ones, a sign of courage and love in the midst of so much darkness.

As I was thinking over what Lenten reading to suggest to the parish, I had so many ideas buzzing around in my head it was hard to decide what would be the best book, but I wanted to have something that would be a complement to our Advent reading. Elias Chacour was the Melkite Catholic Archbishop of Galilee who grew up in Palestine before the establishment of the State of Israel in a place where Jews, Muslims and Christians coexisted in relative peace. He had a fascinating life, trained in Europe with a ministry of peacemaker in some amazing situations that would make most of us nervous to say the least.

His book *Blood Brothers* was originally published in 1984, and has been through several editions. Nominated three times for a Nobel Peace Prize for his work, he is now retired but still active in efforts at justice and reconciliation. So why am I recommending this book? Well, often we read histories of saintly lives that seem like fairy tales or adventure stories that can seem awfully far from our own. We also may appreciate the political and economic situations that they lived under, but they are not always as timely or relevant to us. This book tells the story of an ordinary family practicing their faith and their commitment to peace under conditions that are very real for us today.

As Christians, the Holy Land is very special to us, as it is Jews and Muslims. But often American Christians, especially our evangelical friends, have very strange ideas about the history of this land, and of what it all means for them and for those who live there. Even if you may not agree some of the political implications of Archbishop Elias' story, it is still a story of how we can build a civilization of peace where bitter enemies can be reconciled. He tells of how his first assignment as a priest was to a town and a parish which was apparently irretrievably broken by hatred, and how he set about fixing it. There is a lot of food for thought in this challenging book.

Lent is a time of reconciliation with God and with one another, of finding pardon and peace even in times of war and strife. My hope is this book will give you much meditation on what it means to be a peacemaker in our day and time. LINK TO BOOK.



days of fasting and abstinence

The present laws of the Church regarding fasting and abstinence during the Season of Lent are as follows:

- I. Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of fasting. On days of fasting, one full meal is allowed. Two lesser meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted. Catholics who have completed their 18th year are bound by this law until the beginning of their 60th year.
- 2. Ash Wednesday and all Fridays of Lent are also days of abstinence. On days of abstinence, meat should not be eaten at any meal. The law of abstinence binds all Catholics who have completed their 14th year.

The obligation to observe, as a whole or "substantially," the penitential days specified by the Church is a serious obligation. The Code of Cannon Law states: "On these days (of Penance), the faithful are in a special manner to devote themselves to prayer, to engage in works of piety and charity, to deny themselves, by fulfilling theur obligations more faithfully and especially by observing the fast and abstinence..."
