Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

The spots for the pilgrimage to Greece and Turkey are filling up fast, so get signed up now before you lose out. This is the first time I have led a pilgrimage as pastor of Prince of Peace, but I remember going on pilgrimage to the Holy Land with Msgr Brovey with many of you when I was a recently ordained priest, and I

have also been on other pilgrimages as well. I also have had the great joy to live in places where pilgrims were a usual sight, in Rome and in Pamplona in Spain which is part of the Way of St James to Compostela. Vatican II spoke of the People of God as a Pilgrim Church. We are a people on the move, a dynamic, static group, not meandering nowhere fast, but step by step to the new and eternal Jerusalem. Pilgrimage is a part of our Christian story.

Here are ten things I have learned from being a pilgrim:

- 1. We need to pack our bags and go somewhere sometimes to learn how to lose our baggage and be where we are.
- 2. The annoyances and trivialities of traveling nowadays are great opportunity for penance.
- 3. Ice and butter are not universal, so get used to lukewarm Coke and oil with bread.
- 4. No, not everyone speaks English everywhere. Become a master at Charades!
- 5. Pilgrimage is not like quiet adoration in a chapel somewhere. It can be loud, exhausting, exasperating and annoying.
- 6. If something can go wrong, it will, so flexibility and adaptability are important life skills.
- 7. Memories made on pilgrimage with fellow pilgrims forge a bond that few other human experiences can bring about.
- 8. The Church is truly universal, and people everywhere share the same hopes, dreams, worries and fears.
- 9. What unites is more powerful than what divides us.
- 10. Situational awareness is important in every situation.


the arm of st jude the apostle

# days of fasting and abstinence

The present laws of the Church regarding fasting and abstinence during the Season of Lent are as follows:

I. Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of fasting. On days of fasting, one full meal is allowed. Two lesser meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted. Catholics who have completed their 18th year are bound by this law until the beginning of their 60th year.

2. Ash Wednesday and all Fridays of Lent are also days of abstinence. On days of abstinence, meat should not be eaten at any meal. The law of abstinence binds all Catholics who have completed their 14th year.

The obligation to observe, as a whole or "substantially," the penitential days specified by the Church is a serious obligation. The Code of Cannon Law states: "On these days (of Penance), the faithful are in a special manner to devote themselves to prayer, to engage in works of piety and charity, to deny themselves, by fulfilling theur obligations more faithfully and especially by observing the fast and abstinence..."
