Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

There are many Catholics in the past few years who have been very concerned over where they feel the Church is going. Many of us say with Peter, *To whom shall we go, Lord? You have the words of everlasting life.* We know that the Catholic Church possesses the fullness of truth, and that history gives us ample evidence of the enduring holiness of the Church even in the midst of corruption and depravity. But there are those whose faith is weaker. Some just check out of religion altogether. Some become Protestant Christians. And not a few, including some high profile thinkers like Rod Dreher, look East. The Eastern Orthodox Churches have become a haven for many confused Catholics in our times. One such man is a young podcaster and writer named Michael Lofton, who became a Catholic in 2012, converted to Orthodoxy only two years later after a negative experience with a priest, and then returned to the Catholic Church three years afterwards.

At first glance, Orthodoxy seems to be so similar to Catholicism that it seems like a no-brainer for those who want ancient Christianity without the pope. Numerous Evangelical and Anglican Christians have become Orthodox instead of Catholic for that very reason, and now there are Catholics making the same journey. The things that separate Orthodox and Catholic from full communion are often very complex and subtle. Apologists on both sides often spill amazing amounts of cyberink and real ink that make most people's heads hurt. I have spent years studying these questions, all the while wishing that there was a book that was easily accessible that could address these issues.

Answering Orthodoxy: A Catholic Response to Attacks from the East by Michael Lofton is just such a book. There are doctrinal, historical and liturgical attacks against the Catholic Church that have become very widespread in certain circles of Orthodoxy. There's also a whole weird subculture of "Orthobros" who are often converts to Orthodoxy who spend hours on the internet trying to snare Catholics into an Eastern counterpart to the "Rad Trads." This book does a tremendous job of looking at each one of the major serious issues that divide us and explaining the Catholic position on these issues. As a young man he had to struggle intellectually with each one of them, and does a great job of making the fruit of his struggle accessible.

Now, that having been said, while I do highly recommend this book, I have seen a lot of other writings of Michael Lofton that, as a dogmatic theologian, I think are very much off the mark. Much of his speculation on the role of the papacy within Catholic dogma I find hardly in line with what the Magisterium actually teaches on the subject and a peculiarly American reflex to papal maximalism and a naïve understanding of ecclesiastical authority. I can't recommend anything else he was written, but I can this book.

## days of fasting and abstinence

The present laws of the Church regarding fasting and abstinence during the Season of Lent are as follows:

I. Ash Wednesday and **Good Friday** are days of fasting. On days of fasting, one full meal is allowed. Two lesser meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted. Catholics who have completed their 18th year are bound by this law until the beginning of their 60th year.

2. Ash Wednesday and **all Fridays of Lent** are also days of abstinence. On days of abstinence, meat should not be eaten at any meal. The law of abstinence binds all Catholics who have completed their 14th year.

The obligation to observe, as a whole or "substantially," the penitential days specified by the Church is a serious obligation. The Code of Canon Law states: "On these days (of Penance), the faithful are in a special manner to devote themselves to prayer, to engage in works of piety and charity, to deny themselves, by fulfilling their obligations more faithfully and especially by observing the fast and abstinence..."
