### Letter from our Pastor, Fr Christopher Smith

An Extraordinary Parish for Ordinary People

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ.

For obvious reasons, I am not the person to come to for parenting advice.

counsel, moral guidance, and a pep talk, perhaps. Sacrament, definitely. But specific parenting advice is not something that I dare to dispense, even though I do get requests for interventions in specific situations. Sr Lucia, the visionary of Fatima is famous for saying, "The final battle will be over the family." And I think it is clear to everyone that marriage and family life is under attack like never before, and the Christian message on it is increasingly ignored in favour of what seems to be a very indeterminate conception of the human person and how society is supposed to work.

The priests of the Diocese met last month on convocation to discuss and hear talks about youth ministry. One of the books that the presenter recommended was written in 2004, but has become all the more timely. Hold On to Your Kids: Why Parents Need to Matter More Than Peers by Gordon Neufeld and Gabor Mate, explores how sacrificing the role of parenting to your children's peers, teachers or other adults is a recipe for disaster. It also goes into best practices for character formation in children which are explained in a clear and concise way.

Social media, technology and the internet are all amazing tools for the progress of civilization. But we are also seeing the dark side of these gifts and how children are affected by them in ways that are not always positive. I constantly come across families where children's use of these tools was not monitored closely and tutelage wisely by their parents and all sorts of tragedies have resulted. I also see parents who are becoming dangerously disconnected from their marriages and their families because of indiscriminate use of social media, technology and the internet.

I don't want to see you all turn into Luddites who live in another century. The Church is not supposed to be a fortress to keep out the bad but salt and light within the City of Man, transforming culture from within by grace. But we have to be smart about the real consequences and pitfalls of tools we can also use for good.

#### monday morning workout for men





#### days of fasting and abstinence

The present laws of the Church regarding fasting and abstinence during the Season of Lent are as follows:

- I. Ash Wednesday and **Good Friday** are days of fasting. On days of fasting, one full meal is allowed. Two lesser meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted. Catholics who have completed their 18th year are bound by this law until the beginning of their 60th year.
- 2. Ash Wednesday and **all Fridays of Lent** are also days of abstinence. On days of abstinence, meat should not be eaten at any meal. The law of abstinence binds all Catholics who have completed their 14th year.

The obligation to observe, as a whole or "substantially," the penitential days specified by the Church is a serious obligation. The Code of Canon Law states: "On these days (of Penance), the faithful are in a special manner to devote themselves to prayer, to engage in works of piety and charity, to deny themselves, by fulfilling their obligations more faithfully and especially by observing the fast and abstinence..."
