Letter from our Pastor, Fr Christopher Smith

An Extraordinary Parish for Ordinary People

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Tomorrow our Muslim brothers and sisters begin their holy month of Ramadan. They fast from all food and drink, even water, from dawn to sunset, and are encouraged to read their holy book, the Qur'an, once again during the month. At sunset, they go to the mosque and say their prayers and break the fast with a date (the fruit, not a significant other) and join their family and friends with the entire community at a festive meal, called an *iftar*. They often enjoy each other's company far into the night, and as sunrise nears, they have their last sustenance of water and food to prepare for the day. In Turkey, drummers in Ottoman era dress go all around the neighborhoods calling attention to the fast which is coming. The fasting period is both a time of introspection and growing in faith as well as festivity and togetherness. Their discipline has been the same for over 1400 years, and is the same the world over.

Christian fasting has gone through various changes in discipline over the centuries. The ancient fasting and abstinence rules for Lent are now considered extreme and unhealthy by many people today, who for some reason can't explain why religious orders like the Carthusians and the Trappists see the burial of most of their monks and nuns well into old age! The contemporary discipline binding on the faithful of the Latin Church is barely a faint echo of what our fathers in faith did with lots less resources than we have today.

Christian fasting during Lent also has a much less joyful character than the Islamic fasting of Ramadan. We tend to associate this asceticism quite naturally with the Passion and Death of Jesus, and so it appears quite unseemly to be gorging ourselves on food and drink as we commemorate the emaciated Body of the Redeemer struggling to breathe His last. The specter of human suffering should cause us to mourn in solidarity with the Crucified God. We often try not to talk too much about our individual penances and mortifications, and spiritual writes warn that we can lose any merit gained by them if we cause pride to take their value away. And so often we fast and pray in silence, alone and without anyone to share what is going on in our souls during this sacred season. Jesus went out alone into the desert, and so naturally the solitude of Lent feels somehow right as the Christian faces the world, the flesh and the devil.

At the same time, however, I do wonder how our experience of fasting as a Church family might change if we greeted the coming of Ash Wednesday, not with dread, but with festive joy as if welcoming a familiar friend. How would our church community be better if we checked in on each other during Lent, and came together to break the fast? So many people eat alone at Easter when the fast is over, just like they do every other day, fasting or not. Have you ever thought to ask what the person down the pew from you is doing for Easter and invited them to your table to feast after the fast? Better yet, can you imagine if the entire parish prayed the whole night with the Great Paschal Vigil and had an amazing meal together where everyone was fed and all took turns serving each other?

I am firmly convinced that the reason that this seems like such an absurd proposal to us is that our Lent has become seriously weak, and we're not really allowing the fast to take hold of us so the feast can revive us. Lent is half over today. Finish strong, and if you've fumbled it so far, today is the day to begin again. Rejoice!



- not have a child (or grandchild) receiving the sacrament of Confirmation at Prince of Peace in the next five years



days of fasting and abstinence

The present laws of the Church regarding fasting and abstinence during the Season of Lent are as follows:

- I. Ash Wednesday and **Good Friday** are days of fasting. On days of fasting, one full meal is allowed. Two lesser meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted. Catholics who have completed their 18th year are bound by this law until the beginning of their 60th year.
- 2. Ash Wednesday and **all Fridays of Lent** are also days of abstinence. On days of abstinence, meat should not be eaten at any meal. The law of abstinence binds all Catholics who have completed their 14th year.

The obligation to observe, as a whole or "substantially," the penitential days specified by the Church is a serious obligation. The Code of Canon Law states: "On these days (of Penance), the faithful are in a special manner to devote themselves to prayer, to engage in works of piety and charity, to deny themselves, by fulfilling their obligations more faithfully and especially by observing the fast and abstinence..."
